- **WEATHER:** Be aware at all times of current weather conditions and effects on fire behavior and adjust tactics accordingly. Plan ahead and be prepared to disengage early.
- **COMMUNICATIONS:** Make sure you have established clear communications with assigned and adjacent resources. Know the Communications Plan and also what to do in the event of a medical emergency (see Medical Plan).
- **DRIVING:** Drive defensively at all times and maintain safe vehicle separation distances. Keep head lights on and use emergency lighting where appropriate. Use spotters when backing or in tight areas. Keep stopping distance $\frac{1}{2}$ your sight distance.
- **SNAGS AND HAZARD TREES:** Park in areas free of snags and hazard trees. Fall trees only within your certification level or flag and avoid.



7. Help me! I've fallen and I can't get up!

Review your 8-line before you need it.

First - provide lifesaving emergency care. Next - yell for help! Turn to the IWI 8-line and follow the script. For code yellow or code red medicals, which by definition require emergency transport, call 911 by cell phone (day or night), or Cody Dispatch on Command (day), or MEDL Wayne Hare (day or night) on command or cell at 435-260-0051. Explain briefly what you've got and what transport you need. If you feel the patient needs Life Flight, ask for it. You will have to provide lat/long locations soon after contacting 911.

For code green medicals, contact division who will arrange for appropriate transport. It is important for Division and MEDL H are to be notified of **all** medicals as soon as possible.

FOR A NON-EMERGENCY INCIDENT, WORK THROUGH CHAIN OF COMMAND TO REPORT AND TRANSPORT INJURED PERSONNEL AS NECESSARY.

FOR A MEDICAL EMERGENCY: IDENTIFY ON-SCENE INCIDENT COMMANDER BY NAME AND POSITION AND ANNOUNCE "MEDICAL EMERGENCY" TO INITIATE RESPONSE FROM IMT COMMUNICATIONS/DISPATCH.

Ex: "Communications, I have a Red priority patient, unconscious, struck by a falling tree. Requesting air ambulance to Forest Road 1 at (Lat./Long.) This will be the Trout Meadow Medical, IC is TFLD Jones. EMT Smith is providing medical care."
