Plan and implement suppression actions that commit responders only to operations when and where they have a reasonable probability of success and under conditions where critical values at risk are protected with the least exposure necessary.</p> <p><b>OBJECTIVES FOR FIREFIGHTER AND PUBLIC SAFETY</b> Safety of firefighters and the public will be the highest priority throughout all phases of the incident. Manage the risk to fire fighters and the public by utilizing a risk management-based approach.</p> <p><b>OBJECTIVES FOR PROTECTION OF VALUES AT RISK</b> Utilize appropriate strategies to minimize negative impacts to critical community infrastructure, private lands, and improvements to reduce the potential for adverse health, social, financial, and economic hardships. **Discussion:** Deep monsoonal moisture will continue wetting rain showers and afternoon thunderstorms through the weekend. Today, morning rain showers will start the day and lasting through most of the operational period. We can expect some afternoon thunderstorms, bringing the risk for lightning, gusty winds, and locally heavy rainfall. Plus, this amount of moisture, in the form of rainfall, will raise the risk for flash flooding, mudslides, and debris flow within the fire area. Roads may be challenging to traverse as well. Outside of any thunderstorm gusts, winds will generally be westerly to southwesterly at speeds of 3-7 mph. Our temperatures will be cooler, in the upper 50s to mid-60s in the upper elevations and around 70s in the valleys with min relative humidities bottoming out at 50 to 60 percent. Rain shower activity will decrease in the late afternoon to evening hours. Tomorrow, we will have another wet and cool day with high chances for wetting rain showers and chances for afternoon thunderstorms.

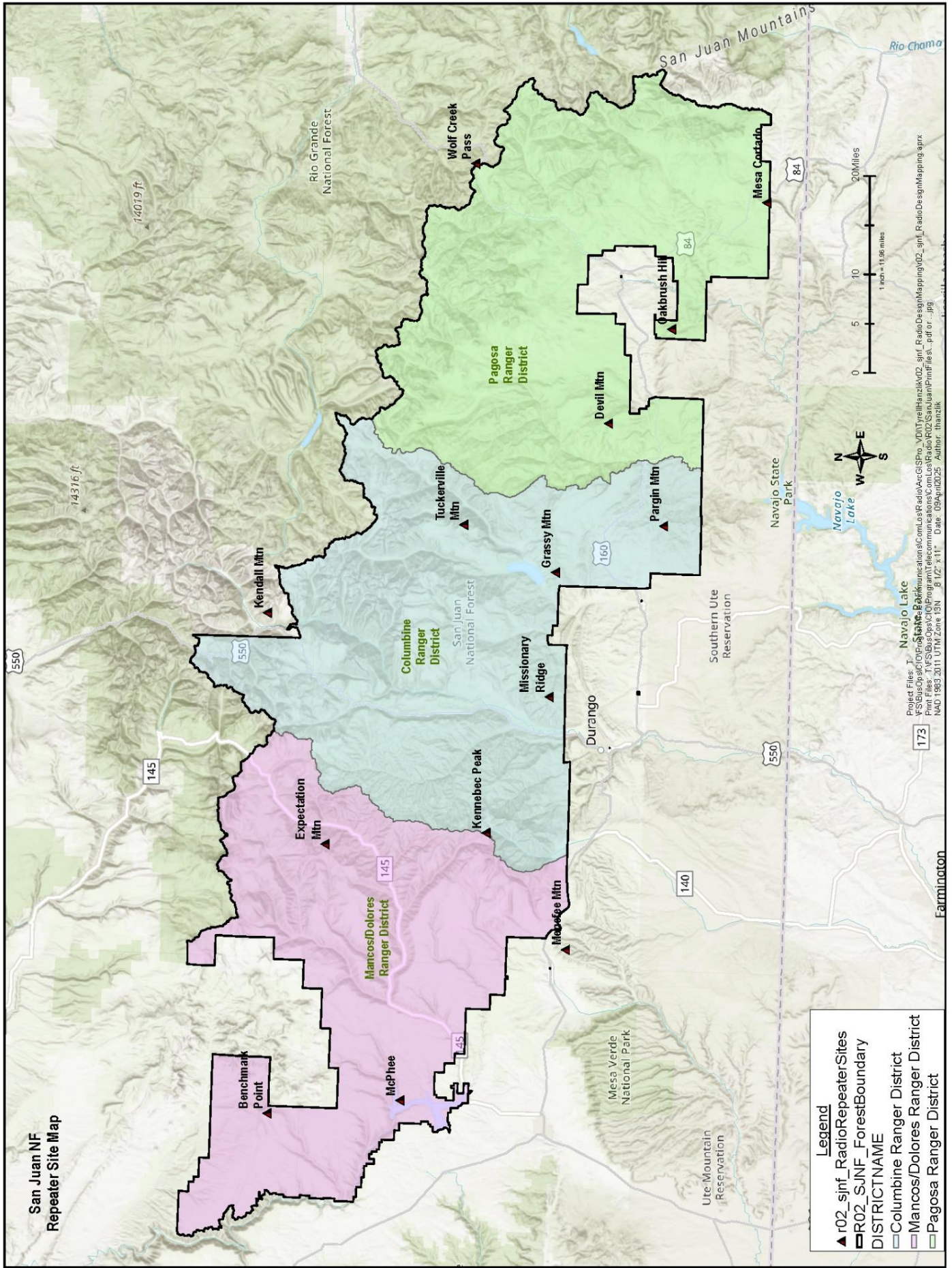

## Mitigating Smoke Exposure

Just because smoke is not an issue right now on Stoner Mesa doesn't mean we shouldn't talk about it. Potential exists during the remainder of the season and moving into RX burning. Smoke exposure can lead to both short-term and long-term health issues. Here are **key steps** you should take to mitigate smoke exposure:

### 1. Use Personal Protective Equipment (PPE)

- **Respirators:** Use N95 masks or P100 respirators when practical (especially during mop-up or low-activity times).

### 2. Monitor Air Quality

- Use real-time **air quality monitors** or check with agencies (e.g., EPA's AirNow).
- Use portable air quality monitors on the line if available.

### 3. Implement Work/Rest Cycles

- Follow agency guidelines for **adequate rest and recovery** to minimize cumulative exposure.
- Rotate personnel more frequently when smoke concentrations are high.

### 4. Positioning and Tactics

- Stay **upwind** of the fire and smoke when possible.
- Limit time spent in **smoke-heavy areas** (e.g., during mop-up or holding operations).
- Use **vehicle cabs with air filters** as a break from smoke when safe.

### 5. Maintain Physical Health

- Stay **hydrated** — smoke dries out airways, increasing irritation.
- **Avoid smoking or vaping**, which can amplify damage from wildfire smoke.
- Don't ignore symptoms and health changes: Keep up with annual Dr. visits/Saf.

### 6. Decontamination

- Wash face and hands frequently to remove particulate matter.
- Shower and change clothes after a shift to remove smoke residues.

### 7. Training and Awareness

- Ensure all crew members are trained on **smoke hazards** and how to mitigate them.
- Use health check-ins and safety briefings to monitor exposure-related symptoms.
