








# San Juan Public Lands Approved Fire Management Objectives

This map can be used by initial responders and IC's to rapidly identify which areas of San Juan Public Lands that naturally ignited wildfires can be managed for resource objectives. Open this map in Avenza Maps to determine which fire management objective(s) may be available for your incident of interest.

Only naturally ignited (lightning) wildfires may be managed for objectives other than full suppression. All human caused fires will be suppressed regardless of where they occur.

Lightning caused fires may be managed in green areas of this map (Managed Fires Allowable).

In red areas of this map, fire management actions will focus on minimizing final fire size (Managed Fire Not Allowable).

In hatched areas of the map on Pagosa Ranger District, suppression is the preferred objective regardless of LRM direction, due to circumstances deemed by Pagosa RD leadership to preclude management of wildfires for other than suppression objectives (Suppression Objective Preferred).

In amber areas of the map on the San Juan NF wildfire managed for resource objectives is restricted (Managed Fire Restricted). Generally the preferred objective will be suppression. Consult the San Juan NF Spatial Fire Plan in WFSSS.

Potential opportunities to manage wildfire for resource objectives will only be considered after consultation with the local Fire Management Officer and Line Officer. In all cases public safety is the number one priority for all fire management activities, regardless of incident strategies.

Fires occurring in Special Areas/Designations (Wilderness, WSA, RNA) require Line Officer approval of motorized equipment, including chainsaws, pumps and ATV/UTVs.
