INCIDENT: Wrangler Fire DATE: 10/25/2010 Shift: 0700-1900

<u>Fire Order of the Day – Ensure that instructions are given and understood.</u>

Major Hazards and Risks: driving, snags & burning green trees, poison oak, snags, poisonous critters, snags, communications, snags, tunder storms, snags, complacency.

<u>DRIVING:</u> Watch out for the public. We are visitors, and the locals will not be expecting to see us as they make their routine routes. Head lights on always and as we work along the road use hazard blinkers and any emergency lights mounted on your vehicles.

<u>SNAGS</u>: As the troops move into the fire for mopup and patrol, snag hazards increase. Keep looking up and flag and avoid areas where snags may come down. If you see smoke around the base of a green tree, remember they may be weakened from fire in their roots. Be sure to patrol and re-check areas where snags may spread fire over the lines.

<u>MOP UP HAZARDS:</u> Now is the time when fatigue, horseplay and letting your guard down result in "stupid accidents". Keep looking for productive work and use the proper PPE. Don't bunch up when working stump holes or hot spots. WEAR EYE PROTECTION when using nozzles.

<u>DEHYDRATION:</u> Even though the fire has cooled down, firefighters continue to work hard. You will still need to replenish your body by drinking lots of water. Always remember to drink at least 4 waters to every 1 sports drink consumed. Add sports drinks and fruit drinks after shift to replace electrolytes.

18. TAKING A NAP NEAR THE FIRELINE

Look Up, Look Down, Look Around

*Look Up: Check the sky for any weather changes such as building or approaching thunderstorms, wind shifts or increasing in speed. Look for snags.

*Look Down: Watch your footing. Keep an eye out for snakes, bees nests and observe needle cast and leaves dropping on the ground.

* Look Around: Watch out for potential of re-burn. Look for smoke around the base of green trees. Roots burning weaken standing trees.

MIST Guidelines

MIST Guidelines - Mop Up and Rehab:

The Wrangler Fire is in the Kisatchie Hills Wilderness. Practice "Light Hand On The Land" tactics to minimize the impacts of fire suppression and management activities on the wilderness resource. See p.100 of IRPG.

- Never compromise firefighter safety in the name of MIST. Safety is Always our top priority.
- Use <u>Cold Trailing</u> as much as possible.
- Move/roll downed materials if possible; otherwise, buck the material.
- Limit the cutting of trees and snags.
- Cut all stumps flush with the ground. Lop and scatter tops and brush.
- Waterbars/waterbreaks:
 - o Locate the highest elevation waterbar on slope within 20 feet of top of slope.
 - o Locate the lowest elevation waterbar at least 50 feet from all drains, streams, and scour channels.
 - o Pack (with feet or dozer tracks) all waterbars, especially downhill berm.
 - Construct waterbars at angle of 35-50 degrees downslope, with minimum height of waterbar berm of 18".
 - Waterbar outlet should extend to undisturbed forest soil at same grade of waterbar channel for minimum length of two feet.
 - Place a waterbar at least every 6 feet elevation change of the fireline. When in Doubt Put in MORE!
