Safety Message

Oct 16, 2010

Driving:

We are utilizing routes shared by other drivers. Heavy traffic increases the possibility of meeting vehicles going the opposite direction you are. **Drive defensively**; maintain a **safe speed for existing conditions**.

Environmental:

Prevent dehydration by drinking plenty of water. The **steep rocky slopes** may cause you to lose your footing. Heavy material can break loose on steep slopes and roll downhill. Warn others below if you kick something loose. **Yellow Jackets (ground nesters), fire ants, snakes and poison ivy** could be a problem. If you are allergic, notify your supervisor immediately.

Snags & Hazard Trees:

Snags will fall; don't let your guard down. Identify hazardous snags in work areas and avoid or remove. Snags will be felled only when they pose a threat to safety. **Only qualified fallers will cut snags**.

If you see a hazardous situation either remove it, fix it, mitigate it or tell someone who can.

If DIVS is unavailable, the nearest fireline Supervisor or Leader needs to take charge.</p> <p>*Clear all radio traffic on incident "Command Channel"-Use to coordinate response – do not use names.</p> <p>*Obtain and facilitate nearest EMTs to the scene, request medical unit response – DIVS in charge of scene.</p> <p>*Coordinate and facilitate appropriate transportation for injured with Medical Unit – EMT in charge of patient.</p> <p>*Provide the following information: Nature of problem, # of injuries, Condition and Vitals, Location (GPS location)</p> <p>*Remove all unnecessary personnel from the accident scene – notify Safety Officer.</p> <p>*Secure the scene and identify witness for later investigation – keep a log.</p> <p>When a meeting point has been arranged with rescue or ambulance, personnel and patient need to remain at that location.</p> <p>If air resources are needed coordinate with Air Operations/MEDL</p> <p>MEDL Shanna Ellis Cell 318-229-6515 (day or night)</p>
