It is essential that employees and supervisors accurately and clearly report time on the CTR in order to facilitate recording of time on the OF-288 (Emergency Time Incident Report).

A CTR is prepared for each operational period. Time must be reported in an accurate, legible fashion at the end of the operational period and given to the Time Unit after getting Supervisor's signature Supervisor certifies time worked by signing the CTR. Individuals may not sign their own CTR.

Travel time is reported with a "T" entered in the Remarks No. (6) column.

Time spent eating must be shown as a break on the Crew Time Report. A **meal period of at least 30 minutes must be taken for each work shift** (a minimum 30 minute break for every shift of eight hours).

Military time shall be used on all records pertaining to timekeeping and time recording.

A CTR is prepared for each operational period as outlined below.

Time must be reported in an accurate, legible fashion.

At the end of the operational period, the original is signed by the Supervisor and given to the Time Unit. A copy is retained by the supervisor.

- 1. **Crew Name**. Use crew name or name of single resource (individual).
- 2. Crew Number. Enter assigned resource order number (will be given).
- 3. Office Responsible for Fire. Enter incident agency (appropriate federal, state, or local office).
- 4. Incident Name. Enter assigned incident name (will be given).
- 5. Incident Number. Enter incident order number (will be given).
- 6. Remarks No. Enter number that corresponds to Remarks in Section 11 or "T" for travel time.
- 7. Name of Employee. Self-explanatory.
- 8. Classification. Enter appropriate pay classification (AD-A through AD-M, GS, WG, etc.).
- 9. <u>Date</u>. Enter month/day/year (8/3/XX) in Date Block. Under MilitaryTime Heading, enter military clock time for each period of on-shift time during the operational period. **Round to nearest quarter hour (15 minutes)**.
- 10. <u>Date</u>. If the operational period involves two days, use column 10 as instructed in Number 9 above.
- 11. <u>Remarks</u>. Enter any pertinent information such as injury, discharge, transfer, position change, reason for hazard/environmental differential, compensable meal break, etc. Include Remarks No. from Item 6.
- 12. Officer-in-Charge. Signature of your supervisor. You may not sign your own CTR.
- 13. Title. Officer-in-Charge. Self-explanatory (ICS position).
- 14. <u>Name</u>. Signature of person (PTRC or TIME) recording time on the Emergency Firefighter Time Report, OF-288.
- 15. Date. Date that time was recorded on OF-288.


