- Post lookouts or spotters in mop-up areas.

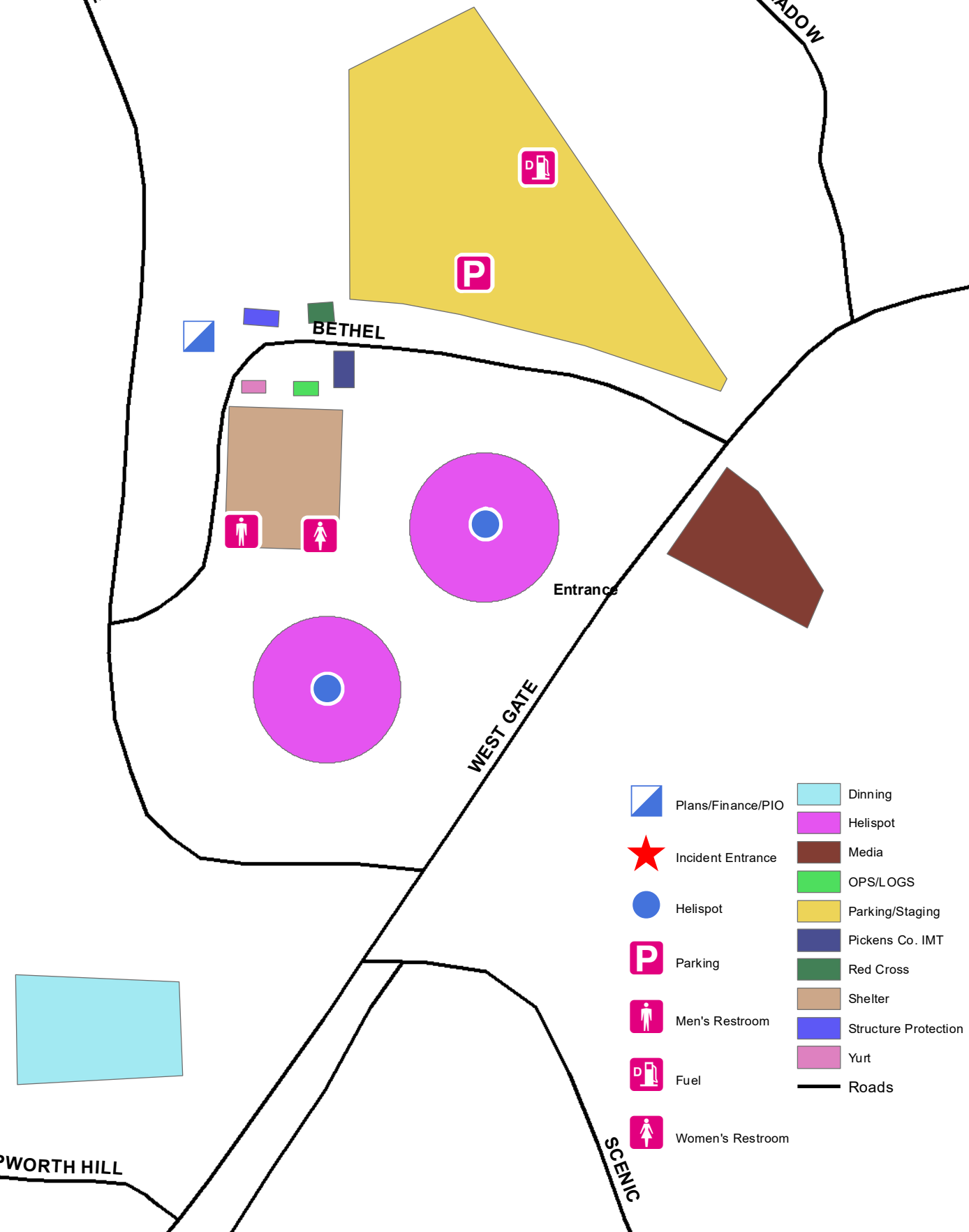
