**WEATHER DISCUSSION:** High pressure over the southeast this morning will gradually drift northeast today and Saturday. Increasing moisture aloft this afternoon will spread high clouds over the region later today and tonight. Clouds will gradually increase late Saturday and Saturday night with patches of light rain spreading over the area Sunday and Sunday night. 
