# Safety Message

INCIDENT: **Pinnacle Mountain**

DATE: December 4, 2016

## Major Hazards and Risks

- **ATV/UTV: Operate** within machine and driver capabilities. Maintain equipment by performing a preventative maintenance check daily before operational shift.
- **DRIVING:** Observe posted speed limits, drive defensively, and watch out for traffic on hwy. 11. Dirt roads on the fire have become slick where disturbed by heavy equipment prior to the rain.
- **SNAGS:** Are present in all divisions. As **mop up** begins, be on the lookout for hazard trees that may have been missed or have **deteriorated** over time and have become dangerous.

## Fire Order of the Day

*Fight fire aggressively, having provided for **SAFETY** first*

- Keep your subordinates informed.....how do you plan for the weather today?
- Make sound and timely decisions.....set "Trigger Points" and USE THEM!
- Ensure tasks are understood, supervised, and accomplished.....what can I do.....who can I help?
- Use subordinates in accordance with their capabilities.....help them be successful.

## WATCH OUT SITUATION of the DAY

Instructions and Assignments not Clear



## COMMUNICATION RESPONSIBILITIES

- Brief others as needed.....give good briefings
- Debrief your actions.....provide quality feedback
- Communicate hazards....use the Incident Risk Analysis 215A
- Acknowledge messages....ask for feedback
- Ask if you don't know...ensure you understand

## Transition Day

- Accidents can happen during a transition period.
- Ensure that you know your supervisor.
- Maintain prompt communications.
- Confirm radio frequencies.
- Be sure that you give and receive clear instructions.
- Freely share any information that you may have.

**WEATHER DISCUSSION:** High pressure at the surface will remain in place today. Meanwhile moisture aloft will spread over the region from the southwest ahead of a mid-level wave. Light rain will develop by daybreak and continue for much of the day, possibly becoming moderate to heavy this afternoon. The wave will exit east tonight, bringing an end to rain and setting up a brief drying period. A more significant storm will emerge from the northwestern Gulf of Mexico late Monday and quickly move across the southeast Monday night and Tuesday with widespread showers expected. High pressure will build over the area from the west during the middle of the week with a dry cold front bringing arctic air to the region Thursday night.
