



Steps to follow
Escort symptomatic individual to isolation area.
Isolation support personnel should begin documentation.
Have symptomatic individual contact Supervisor for further direction.
Notify public health officials.
Have individual transported as appropriate.
Protect and secure any collected Personal Identifiable Information (PII) or Personal Health Information (PHI).

CORONAVIRUS SAFETY

LIMIT THE SPREAD OF GERMS AND PREVENT INFECTION

Recommends the following steps to help prevent the spread of germs during this situation:

- Practice social distancing by keeping about six feet from others if you must go out in public.
- Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, especially after being in a public place, or after blowing your nose, coughing or sneezing. If soap and water are not readily available, use a hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth with unwashed hands.
- Avoid close contact with people who are sick.
- Cover your nose and mouth with a tissue when coughing or sneezing; throw used tissues in the trash. If a tissue isn't available, cough or sneeze into your elbow or sleeve, not your hands.

- If you would like to send a photo of your CTR from the paper copy in your CTR book be sure to double check that it is readable before submitting. Sometimes we get them blurry, folded, upside down or in a weird angle and we can't read it. If given the option of attachment size don't select small as this makes it tiny and unreadable.

SAFETY ALERT

SNAG/GREEN TREE HAZARDS

Falling SNAGS and GREEN trees kill and injure wildland firefighters each year. The seriousness of this situation cannot be over-emphasized.

For your consideration, following is a snag/green tree hazard alert checklist.

- Snags/green trees are falling or have fallen in work area.
- Hazard tree indicators are present in work area.
- High risk tree species are present in work areas.
- Crews are working in a hazard tree area at night.
- Crews are working in a hazard tree area and the wind is blowing.
- Crews are working in an area where trees have been burning for some time.
- The operational period for functional briefing did not include a discussion of hazards.
- Crewmembers are taking a break in a hazard tree area (staging area, drop points, camps, etc.).
- Lookouts have not been posted in a hazard tree area.
- Lookouts are not advising the crew of the presence of hazard trees.
- Winds are increasing or are predicted to increase.
- Tree height within fire perimeter equals or exceeds distance to control line.
- Escape routes pass through hazard tree area.

Following are some rules to remember:

- Help maintain hazard tree awareness at all times for all firefighters.
- Emphasize standard firefighting orders, and Situations that Shout "Watch Out".
- Include "SNAG INTELLIGENCE" in all fire suppression discussions and briefings; i.e., expected burn through time, location and marking, areas of snags, additional hazards due to slope, etc.
- Strengthen leadership communications skills for dealing with diverse organizations and crews.
- Be aware of complacency on fires of all sizes during all phases; particularly during non-threatening and uneventful periods.
- Direct and train all firefighters to do their own safety assessments, and encourage all to interact with their supervisors to ensure better safety.
