



Steps to follow					
Escort symptomatic individual to isolation area.					
Isolation support personnel should begin documentation.					
Have symptomatic individual contact Supervisor for further direction.					
Notify public health officials.					
Have individual transported as appropriate.					
Protect and secure any collected Personal Identifiable Information (PII) or Personal Health Information (PHI).

CORONAVIRUS SAFETY

LIMIT THE SPREAD OF GERMS AND PREVENT INFECTION

Recommends the following steps to help prevent the spread of germs during this situation:

- Practice social distancing by keeping about six feet from others if you must go out in public.
- Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, especially after being in a public place, or after blowing your nose, coughing or sneezing. If soap and water are not readily available, use a hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol.

Most of the resource orders so far are on the Fall Branch fire since we are tracking cost by fire please note in the remarks section which fire. If you pick up a fire on IA, put the name in remarks. If you were on more than one, break out the hours to each fire.
- If you would like to send a photo of your CTR from the paper copy in your CTR book be sure to double check that it is readable before submitting. Sometimes we get them blurry, folded, upside down or in a weird angle and we can't read it. If given the option of attachment size don't select small as this makes it tiny and unreadable.

Hazardous Materials Procedures

If you encounter outbuildings, vehicles and/or homes being threatened or destroyed by fire – remember: Hazardous materials may be stored, including agricultural or industrial chemicals, explosive substances, propane and other fuel tanks, plastics, etc.

If you encounter what you may suspect may be hazardous materials, generally:

Stay upwind, uphill and avoid smoke;


Isolate the area;

Warn others in the immediate area;

Notify your supervisor of the potential problem so trained specialists can evaluate and mitigate the situation; If not properly trained <u>and</u> equipped – **do not** get involved.
