



If resource has cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, or any other listed symptoms including fever (over 100.4) at entry.	

Steps to follow
Escort symptomatic individual to isolation area.
Isolation support personnel should begin documentation.
Have symptomatic individual contact Supervisor for further direction.
Notify public health officials.
Have individual transported as appropriate.
Protect and secure any collected Personal Identifiable Information (PII) or Personal Health Information (PHI).

CORONAVIRUS SAFETY

LIMIT THE SPREAD OF GERMS AND PREVENT INFECTION

Recommends the following steps to help prevent the spread of germs during this situation:

- Practice social distancing by keeping about six feet from others if you must go out in public.
- Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, especially after being in a public place, or after blowing your nose, coughing or sneezing. If soap and water are not readily available, use a hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth with unwashed hands.
- Avoid close contact with people who are sick.
- Cover your nose and mouth with a tissue when coughing or sneezing; throw used tissues in the trash. If a tissue isn't available, cough or sneeze into your elbow or sleeve, not your hands.

If you were on more than one, break out the hours to each fire.
- If you would like to send a photo of your CTR from the paper copy in your CTR book be sure to double check that it is readable before submitting. Sometimes we get them blurry, folded, upside down or in a weird angle and we can't read it. If given the option of attachment size don't select small as this makes it tiny and unreadable.

SAFETY QUOTE FOR THE DAY: "WHEN IN DOUBT, WAIT IT OUT"

- 1. <u>ROCK-N ROLL!</u> With the freezing and thawing of the ground, rocks-r-rolling not only onto the road, but crews are reporting some near misses on the hill. Let's be intensely attentive when driving around corners and on steep hillsides. (SAFE)
- 2. <u>Helmetless Horseman!</u> ATV riders are appearing without full motorcycle helmets. State and Federal regulations require that we all wear these. (NET) Any riders without full helmets will be required to sign organ donor forms.
- 3. <u>HOOD ORNAMENTS!</u> Recently a crew reported a "near-hood-ornament experience" when a very large truck came around a corner. Remember, we aren't the only ones on the roads any more. Practice defensive driving! (Bulletin)
- 4. M*A*S*H*! Recent reports from the med-tent indicate that we need to pay extra special attention to wearing eye protection, using proper lifting techniques as included in the "B-A-C-K" paper we've attached, and proper PPE such as gloves and hard-hats. (Board) No one wants to be M*A*S*H*ed.
- 5. <u>"JUST A SLINGING!"</u> Beginning immediately there will be absolutely no hanging onto helicopter long-lines. In fact, all crewmembers <u>must</u> be a minimum of 200' away from all helicopter sling work. If you have questions please refer again to organ-donor portion of safety manual. (Outside)

PREVENTING LIFTING INJURIES

Balance: Before starting to lift, be sure you are in balance. Are your feet solidly planted? Do you have the object you're lifting evenly distributed?

Alignment: Is your back straight? Be careful with any twisting or turning while carrying a heavy object.

 $\underline{\mathbf{C}}$ enter of gravity: Over your hips. Keep the heavy object in close to your body, don't reach out or extend.

Knees: Use your knees to lift, not your back! We all want strong, healthy backs.

Is it too heavy to safely carry? Get help before moving. If it can't be safely lifted, then don't move it until it can be. Most back accidents occur when we're in a hurry and don't take the time to assess our Balance, Alignment, Center of Gravity, and the use of knees.
