33: Significant events today (closures, evacuations, significant progress made, etc.): Fire remains staffed and was patrolled by ground and aerial resources. Prep of the contingency lines continues on the East Henson Marsh Area comprising 3.5 miles of clearing along the Bear Island Rd., which includes protection of the Power line running along the road and several private inholdings which are indefensible should the fire become active the near future as conditions dry and fire behavior once again become active. Demobilization is accelerating with the measurable precip received during the short						

duration tropical storm yesterday and overnight. The Type 1 Team will transition Monday and transfer command on Tuesday at 0800 to a Type 3 Organization which will continue rehab and for monitoring fire activity until which will be necessary until the season ending event.
