5. General Control Objectives for the incident (include alternatives) <u>Commanders Intent:</u> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. The highest priority is to protect human life followed by protecting communities and identified facilities within the preserve and refuge. Provide for the safety of all incident personnel, the public, and the local cooperators in the planning and execution of all operations. 2. Ensure prompt and accurate communications with the agencies, local county emergency management personnel, BIA Seminole Agency, Seminole and Miccosukee Tribal representatives, local fire departments, and the public. 3. Utilize all available suppression methods and tools to confine all fires within the Preserve. 4. Provide initial attack within the Big Cypress National Preserve, the Florida Panther National Wildlife Refuge, and any initial attack within 2 miles of the reservation boundary. Coordinate all initial attack actions with the respective Fire Management Officers, and tribal representatives. 5. Think, plan, mitigate risk, and communicate leader's intent. Be disciplined and boldly engage in our mission. <u>Tactical Objectives</u> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Maximize suppression opportunities utilizing the existing roads/trails natural/man-made barriers and changes in vegetation/fuels to reduce impacts on the land and resources with particular attention to Red-Cockaded Woodpecker habitat, Florida Panther den sites, and cultural features. 2. Utilize mist and light-handed tactics when appropriate to prevent unnecessary resource damage. Coordinate all planned tactical actions with assigned Resource Advisors. 3. Keep the Strickland fire, within the Preserve, south and west of the sanctuary and south of the Seminole Indian Reservation boundary. 4. Keep the Midrest fire, within the Preserve, north of I-75, south of the Seminole Indian Reservation, and east of the Florida Panther National Wildlife Refuge. 5. FT6, Trail, Shepherd, O'Leary, and Boundary fires are all in a monitor and patrol status. 6. Implement contingency burn-out actions for the Refuge as outlined in the burn plan.
