WEATHER DISCUSSION: A cold front will drop south through Georgia tonight, but remain north of the fire area. Expect another quiet night with light winds and poor dispersion resulting in areas of dense smoke and fog developing.

WEATHER FORECAST:

WEATHER: Partly cloudy. Poor visibility in smoke and fog, especially after midnight.

TEMPERATURES: Low 61 to 65°F, 3 degrees warmer.

HUMIDITY: Rising to between 90 to 100%, unchanged.

20 FT WINDS: East to southeast 3 to 6 mph until 2100, then light and variable.

MIXING HEIGHT: Lowering to around 500 ft.

TRANSPORT WINDS: East to southeast 5 to 8 mph.

OUTLOOK FOR SATURDAY DAY SHIFT: Partly cloudy in the morning, then mostly cloudy with scattered thunderstorms in the afternoon and evening. Chance for wetting rains 50%. Highs 84 to 87°F. <u>Divisions A/B/C/D/E:</u> (Night) Pockets of fire will be active throughout night. Excellent opportunity for burnout and mop up operations most of operational period. Spotting should not be an issue except along flanking fire boundaries.			
<u>Divisions AA/BB/CC:</u> (Night) Pockets of fire will be active throughout night. Spotting will be an issue throughout night although rate of spread will be reduced.. Strong winds from E-to-SE and relative humidity will assist fire's push against any control line aligned perpendicular to its direction of flow until 2100; making for intricate burnout operations. Anticipate spotting from flanking fire as vortices spin column containing embers across control line.			
<u>Structure:</u> (Night) Expect increased fire behavior when structures become involved with fire. Expect encounters with unconventional fuels (i.e., ammunition; noxious smoke from burning plastics and metals; propane gas tanks; creosote-treated utility poles; etc.) Avoid inhaling smoke from these fuels if possible. Space between incoming fire front and structure should be carefully assessed to determine if structure can be safely defended.			
AIR OPERATIONS:			
Dense smoke from plume will continue to interfere with evening aircraft use.			
SAFETY:			
Post lookouts when there is possible danger.

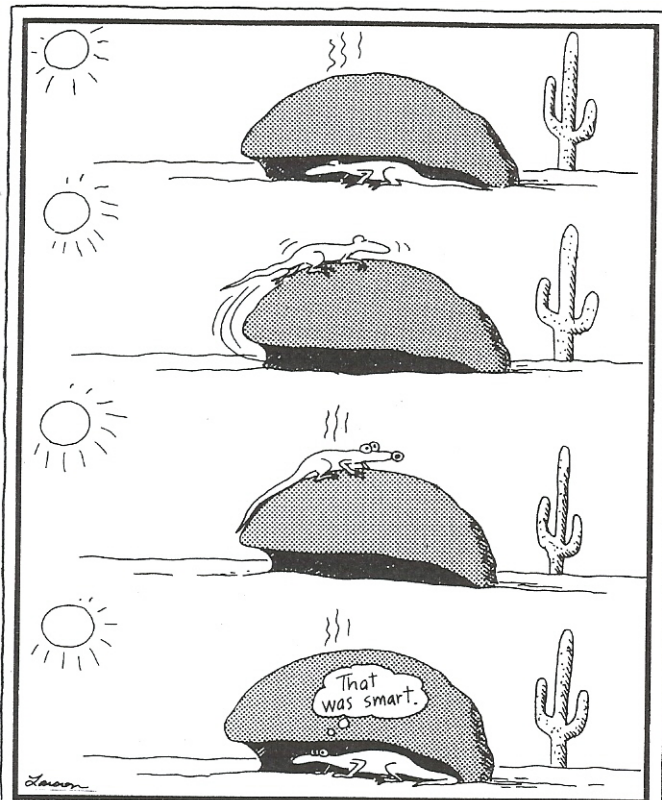
