Provide for the safety of fire suppression forces assigned to the Florida Bugaboo Wildfire and the general public by adhering to the "Standard Fire Orders", "Watch-Out Situations" and by following work/rest guidelines and through public awareness of risks to the community. 2. Maintain and improve relationships with Cooperators including the GOAL organization by providing current information and inviting participation. 3. Provide for a strong commitment to cost containment. 			
6. Weather Forecast for Period High pressure will build further into north Florida today resulting in warmer and drier conditions along with a continuation of the easterly winds. The winds will diminish on Wednesday before another front drops south over the fire area on Thursday bringing another round of northeasterly onshore flow to end the week.			
7. General Safety Message Keep your guard up for changing conditions and react accordingly. Maintain situational awareness at all times. Think ahead and have a contingency plan. Know escape routes and safety zones. <p style="text-align: center;"><u>Road Construction Alert</u></p> The Department of Transportation has advised us that road construction is scheduled for the section of Hwy. 441 between Hwy. 90 and the junction with Hwy. 100A beginning on Tuesday May 15. Traffic delays can be expected in this area over the next several days. If you need to travel to Deep Creek, it is advisable to turn right off Hwy. 90 onto Hwy. 100A just past the airport (as you enter Lake City from the east)and travel Hwy. 100A to Hwy. 441 and then North on Hwy. 441 to Deep Creek. This route will avoid the construction area. You can also access Hwy. 441 from I-10 and then North to Deep Creek.

Major Hazards and Risks:

Driving, Severe Fire Behavior & Structural Protection

Fire Order of the Day –Obtain current information on fire status

Driving hazards –Drive defensively at all times. Watch out for vehicles and personnel along roads. Use seat belts at all time. Traffic congestion around ICP and at intersections and evacuations. Use spotter when backing. Lights on. Remain alert for deer crossing roads.

Severe Fire Behavior = Maintain situational awareness. Rapid rates of spread and spotting. What is your contingency? Don't allow your escape routes to be cut off. Communicate. Know weather forecast. Clear and concise briefings.

Structural Protection = Firefighter safety and survival is number one priority. Down powerlines, gas tanks and traffic. Always stay mobile. Back in equipment. Identify escape routes and safety zones. Keep egress route clear. Go over guidelines on page 14 in IRPG.

Remember the Basics = PPE, Seatbelts, Drive slow, LCES, 10 & 18.

Hazard Trees = Identify, flag and mitigate by chainsaw felling or stay away. Be sure it's a hazard trees before exposing fallers to the hazard of mitigating.

THINK & ACT DECISIVELY: Remember if its Predictable, its Preventable

Common Denominators of Fire Behavior On Tragedy Fires

- *Most incidents happen on the smaller fires or on Isolated portions of larger fires.
- *Most fires are innocent in appearance before the “flare-ups” or “blow-ups”. In some cases, tragedies occur in the mop-up stage.
- *Flare-ups generally occur in deceptively light fuels.
- *Fires run uphill surprisingly fast in chimneys, gullies, chutes and on steep slopes.
- *Some suppression tools, such as helicopters or air tankers, can adversely affect fire behavior. The blasts of air from low flying helicopters and air tankers have been known to cause flare-ups.

WEATHER DISCUSSION: High pressure will build further into north Florida today resulting in warmer and drier conditions, along with a continuation of the easterly winds. The winds will diminish on Wednesday before another front drops south over the fire area on Thursday bringing another round of northeasterly onshore flow to end the week.

WEATHER FORECAST:

WEATHER: Areas of dense smoke from Division BB north to Division DD early. Otherwise, mostly sunny in the morning then partly cloudy.

TEMPERATURES: Highs 85-87.

24 HOUR TREND: 2 degrees warmer.

HUMIDITY: Minimum humidity 34-37%.

24 HOUR TREND: 3% drier.

20 FT WINDS: East winds 7 to 11 mph, with gusts up to 18 mph in the afternoon.

STABILITY/INVERSION: No morning inversion. Mixing height rising to around 5000 ft. Transport winds east 12 to 16 mph, becoming southeast late.

HAINES INDEX: 3, or very low potential for large plume dominated fire growth.

ERC: 40.

OUTLOOK FOR TUESDAY NIGHT SHIFT: Mostly clear. 20 ft winds southeast 2 to 6 mph. Lows 57 to 60. Max RH around 95%.

EXTENDED FORECAST:

Wednesday: Partly cloudy. Highs 87-90. Minimum RH 33-37%. East winds 4 to 8 mph.

Thursday: Partly cloudy. Scattered showers and thunderstorms in the afternoon. Lows 60-63. Highs 86-89. Minimum RH 36-40%. Light and variable winds.

SPECIFIC FIRE BEHAVIOR:			
<p><u>All Divisions:</u> Cypress pockets with ~six-foot high pond shrubs, where there is no surface ponding of water, are supporting surface fire hot enough to scorch overstory cypress. Unless cypress is on outside edge of pocket it does not generally support passive crowning. Bay hardwood, where there is no surface ponding of water, also supports surface fire. However, surface fire is generally not intense enough to scorch overstory bay crowns. Cypress and bay associated understory vegetation, where water ponds, generally do not support combustion.</p> <p><u>Divisions A/B/C/D/E:</u> Isolates of fire in unburned southern rough vegetation will respond to wind and remain active today. Excellent opportunities exist for burnout and mop up operations during operational period. Spotting should not be a problem except where wind flanks fire and vortices develop.</p> <p><u>Divisions AA/BB/CC/DD/EE:</u> Fire will be active again today. Spotting continues to be a constant problem as fire intensity increases with wind speed. Strong winds from E and relative humidity will team up to support fire's push against control line; creating difficult burnout operations. Anticipate spotting from both head and flanking fire, including vortices that contain embers crossing control line.</p> <p><u>Structure:</u> Anticipate increased fire behavior when structures become involved with fire. Expect encounters with unconventional fuels (i.e., ammunition; noxious smoke from burning plastics and metals; propane gas tanks; creosote-treated utility poles; etc.) Avoid inhaling smoke from these fuels if possible. Assess space between incoming fire head and structure determine if structure can be safely defended.</p>			
AIR OPERATIONS:			
Dense smoke from plume may interfere with early morning aircraft use.

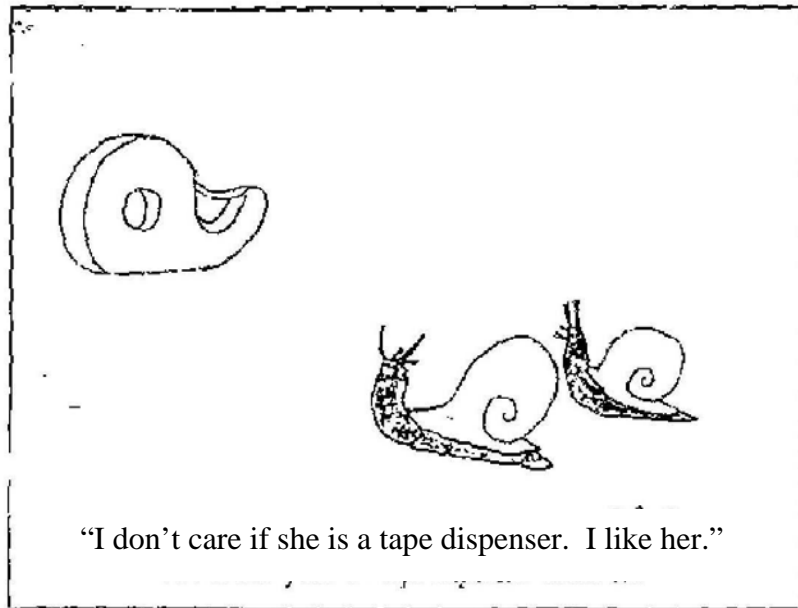
