<p>6. Weather Forecast for Period <b>Red Flag Warning in Effect from 1 pm to 6 pm Today for Low Relative Humidity</b></p> <p>Mostly sunny in the morning then partly cloudy in the afternoon; temperatures 85-88; humidity 26-33%; winds 2-6 mph variable</p>																		
<p>7. General Safety Message</p> <p>Keep your guard up for changing conditions and react accordingly. Maintain situational awareness at all times. Think ahead and have a contingency plan. Know escape routes and safety zones.</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><u>Road Construction Alert</u></p> <p>The Department of Transportation has advised us that road construction is scheduled for the section of Hwy. 441 between Hwy. 90 and the junction with Hwy. 100A beginning on Tuesday May 15. Traffic delays can be expected in this area over the next several days. If you need to travel to Deep Creek, it is advisable to turn right off Hwy. 90 onto Hwy. 100A just past the airport (as you enter Lake City from the east )and travel Hwy. 100A to Hwy. 441 and then North on Hwy. 441 to Deep Creek. This route will avoid the construction area. You can also access Hwy. 441 from I-10 and then North to Deep Creek.</p>

**WEATHER DISCUSSION: Red Flag Warning in Effect from 1 pm to 6 pm Today for Low Relative Humidity**

High pressure will remain in control over north Florida today. The airmass over the fire area will dry out quickly and relative humidity values are expected to fall below 35% for several hours this afternoon prompting the red flag warning. Winds will be light and variable with poorer dispersion today than recent days likely keeping the smoke around through late morning. A cold front will move through tomorrow with isolated to widely scattered showers and thunderstorms possible. More wind and dry weather will then follow for Friday into the weekend.

**WEATHER FORECAST:**

**GENERAL:** Areas of dense smoke and fog through 1100, especially from Deep Creek north. Otherwise, mostly sunny in the morning then partly cloudy in the afternoon.

**All Divisions:** Cypress pockets with ~six-foot high pond shrubs, without impounded water, support surface fire hot enough to scorch overstory cypress. However, unless cypress is on outside edge of pocket it generally does not support passive crowning. Bay hardwood, without impounded water, also supports surface fire. However, surface fire is generally not intense enough to scorch overstory bay crowns. Cypress and bay associated understory vegetation, where water is impounded, generally do not support combustion.

**Divisions A/B/C/D/E:** Pockets of heat near available fuel may still respond to wind and become active. As desiccated pine needles fall to surface and accumulate reburn potential increases. Thick root mat, with duff, gives ground fire an opportunity to retain heat over an extended time period unless dug out. Berms containing burning vegetation will need to be spread out and mopped up appropriately.

**Divisions AA/BB/CC Structure N and S:** Variable winds and low humidity will support aggressive fire spread if given the chance. Spotting will continue to be a threat as fire intensity increases with wind speed. Anticipate spotting from both head and flanking fire, including vortices that contain embers crossing control line.

**AIR OPERATIONS:** Dense smoke from smoke and fog may interfere with early morning aircraft use.

**SAFETY:** Watch out for unburned fuel between you and the fire.
