Maintain and improve relationships with Cooperators including the GOAL organization by providing current information and inviting participation. 3. Provide for a strong commitment to cost containment. 																		
6. Weather Forecast for Period Be on the lookout for erratic, gusty winds and cloud-to-ground lightning with any thunderstorm Scattered showers and thunderstorms through 2200. Chance for wetting rain 30%. Temperatures 59-63. Humidity recovering to between 85 and 95%. Northwest winds 3-7 mph, becoming north by midnight.																		
7. General Safety Message Keep your guard up for changing conditions and react accordingly. Maintain situational awareness at all times. Think ahead and have a contingency plan. Know escape routes and safety zones. <p style="text-align: center;"><u>ROAD CONSTRUCTION ALERT</u></p> The Department of Transportation has advised us that road construction is scheduled for the section of Hwy 441 between Hwy 90 and the junction with Hwy 100A beginning on Tuesday May 15. Traffic delays can be expected in this area over the next several days. If you need to travel to Deep Creek, it is advisable to turn right off Hwy 90 onto Hwy 100A just past the airport (as you enter Lake city from the east) and travel Hwy 100A to Hwy 441 and then North on Hwy 441 to Deep Creek. This route will avoid the construction area. You can also access Hwy 441 from I-10 and then North to Deep Creek.

Bugaboo Incident NF in Florida/Florida Div. of Forestry Forecast #15 5/17/2007 Night

WEATHER DISCUSSION: A weak cold front will sink slowly south tonight bringing an end to any scattered shower or thunderstorm activity this evening. Drier conditions are then expected for Friday through the weekend as winds switch around to a northeasterly direction.

WEATHER FORECAST: *Be on the lookout for erratic, gusty winds and cloud-to-ground lightning with any thunderstorm*

GENERAL: Scattered showers and thunderstorms through 2200. Chance for wetting rain 30%. Partly cloudy in the evening, then clearing

TEMPERATURES: Lows 59 to 63.

24 HOUR TREND: *Unchanged*

HUMIDITY: Recovering to around 85 to 95%.

24 HOUR TREND: *5% drier*

20 FT WINDS: Northwest winds 3 to 7 mph, becoming north by midnight

STABILITY/INVERSION: Mixing height lowering to around 700 feet. Transport winds north 8 to 12 mph. Dispersion index 8.

OUTLOOK:

Friday: Partly cloudy. Highs 82-85. Minimum RH 28-35%. North to northeast winds 6 to 10 mph with a few gusts to 15 mph in the afternoon.

Saturday: Mostly sunny. Lows 52-56. Highs 81-84. Minimum RH 27-32%. Northeast winds 5 to 10 mph.

Sunday: Mostly sunny. Lows 50-54. Highs 83-86. Minimum RH 27-32%. Northeast winds 5 to 10 mph.

Monday: Partly cloudy. Lows 52-56. Highs 84-87. Minimum RH 30-35%. East 5 to 10 mph.

Type of fire: <i>Wind-dominated surface</i>	FL – 8 ft (<2200), 5 ft (>2200)
ROS – 52 ch/hr (<2200), 28 ch/hr (>2200)	SPOTTING – 0.4 mi (<2200), 0.3 mi (>2200)
POI – 60% (<2200), 10% (>2200)	ERC -

CROWN – *Passive when distance between surface and aerial fuel is less than 16 ft (<2200) diminishing to less than 9 ft (>2200), respectively*

SPECIFIC FIRE BEHAVIOR:

All Divisions: *Cypress and bay laurels support surface fire intense enough to scorch overstory, but generally do not support passive crowning (torching) of overstory trees.*

Divisions A/B/C/D/E: *(Night) Pockets of heat near available fuel may still respond to wind, become active, and throw embers across control line. As desiccated pine needles fall to surface and accumulate reburn potential increases.*

Thick root mat, with duff, gives ground fire an opportunity to retain heat over an extended time period unless dug out. Berms containing burning vegetation will need to be spread out and mopped up appropriately.

Divisions AA/BB/C: *(Night) Excellent opportunity for burnout and mop up operations most of this operational period. Winds from NW-to-N will push against any control line aligned perpendicular to its direction of flow. Watch for downwind ember wash and spot fire initiation. Thick root mat, with duff, gives ground fire an opportunity to retain heat over an extended time period unless dug out. Berms containing burning vegetation will need to be spread out and mopped up appropriately.*

Structure: *Anticipate increased fire behavior when structures become involved with fire. Expect encounters with unconventional fuels. Avoid inhaling smoke from these fuels. Assess safe space between incoming fire head and structure.*

AIR OPERATIONS: *Dense smoke from plume may interfere with evening aircraft use.*

☐ SAFETY MESSAGE

- **Driving** – One of the most hazardous operations you will do on any incident is driving. Drive defensively at all times, maintain adequate distance between vehicles and always buckle your seatbelt before the vehicle is in motion. Watch for wildlife crossing the road at night and keep your speed down! Pull over to a safe spot before engaging in cell phone conversations, adjusting the radio or anything else which might distract you from driving safely. Obey all traffic regulations and remember that when you are driving that is the most important job you have at that time.
- **Night Operations** – Visibility is limited during night operations. Reduce speed, use parking lights and emergency flashers when parked. Maintain situational awareness and focus when working around heavy equipment at night.
- **Hazard Trees** - Be alert for hazard trees, identify their location to other personnel working in the area and stay clear of them especially during night operations. Insure that day shift is briefed on their location so felling or removal may be done during daylight.
- **Complacency** – Operations are running smoothly. Don't let this lull you into a complacent attitude especially at night when fire activity may be at a minimum! Stay focused, maintain situational awareness at all times. Remember to look up, look down, and look around. **SAFETY COMES FIRST!**
- **Fire Order of the Night** – Maintain control of your forces at all times.
