7. General Safety Message Keep your guard up for changing conditions and react accordingly. Maintain situational awareness at all times. Think ahead and have a contingency plan. Know escape routes and safety zones. <p style="text-align: center;"><u>Road Construction Alert</u></p> The Department of Transportation has advised us that road construction is scheduled for the section of Hwy. 441 between Hwy. 90 and the junction with Hwy. 100A beginning on Tuesday May 15. Traffic delays can be expected in this area over the next several days. If you need to travel to Deep Creek, it is advisable to turn right off Hwy. 90 onto Hwy. 100A just past the airport (as you enter Lake City from the east)and travel Hwy. 100A to Hwy. 441 and then North on Hwy. 441 to Deep Creek. This route will avoid the construction area. You can also access Hwy. 441 from I-10 and then North to Deep Creek.

GENERAL FIRE BEHAVIOR:

Type of fire: <i>Wind-dominated surface</i>	FL – 10 ft to 13 feet
ROS – 77 to 133 chains per hour	SPOTTING – 0.5 to 0.8 miles
POI – 60%	ERC - 40 – Extreme (Consult pocket card for local fire behavior thresholds)

CROWN – Passive when distance between surface and aerial fuel < 22 ft with 10mph wind and active at 15 mph wind.

SPECIFIC FIRE BEHAVIOR:

All Divisions: : Bay laurels and cypress support surface fire intense enough to scorch overstory, but generally not intense enough to initiate passive crowning (torching). However, incorporated pines may torch and respond with ember wash. Surface vegetation may also throw embers across line and initiate spot fires.

Divisions A/B/C/D/E: **Divisions A/B/C/D/E:** Pockets of heat near available fuel may still respond to wind and low relative humidity, become active, and throw embers into wind stream. Some embers may cross control line. As desiccated pine needles fall to surface, and accumulate, reburn potential increases. Thick root mat, with duff, gives ground fire an opportunity to retain heat over an extended time period unless dug out. Berms containing burning vegetation will need to be spread out and mopped up appropriately.

Divisions AA/BB/CC Structure N and S: Reduced opportunity for low risk burnout operations most of this operational period due to wind direction and low relative humidity. Winds from N-to-NE will push against control line aligned perpendicular to its direction of flow. Watch for downwind ember wash and spot fire initiation. Thick root mat, with duff, gives ground fire an opportunity to retain heat over an extended time period unless dug out. Berms containing burning vegetation will need to be spread out and mopped up appropriately. Anticipate increased fire behavior when structures become involved with fire. Expect encounters with unconventional fuels. Avoid inhaling smoke from these fuels. Assess space between incoming fire head and structure to assess safety of personnel.

AIR OPERATIONS: Dense smoke from plume may interfere with aircraft flexibility.

- **Dozer Operations** – Insure safety zones and escape routes are established and maintain communications with other ground units and aircraft. Avoid plowing in the swamps and bays.
- **Weather** – winds will be increasing and RH will be falling. Insure LCES at all times. Insure that escape routes and safety zones are known and communicated to all personnel on the line.
- **Fatigue/dehydration/personal welfare** – Take care of yourself by getting adequate rest and eating properly. Stay hydrated – if you are not urinating every 3 hours you are not drinking enough fluids.

FIRE BEHAVIOR – It is the job of each firefighter to understand what is happening and to react to it. Predict fire behavior as you fight fire, matching the firefighting tactics to anticipated behavior. If the prediction exceeds the tactics, change the tactics or someone may be hurt.
