6. Weather Forecast for Period ...Red Flag Warning in Effect from 1 pm to 7 pm Today for Low Relative Humidity... Mostly sunny. Pockets of smoke early, especially near Deep Creek and in Divisions AA and BB. Highs of 82-85 with minimum humidity at 26-32%. NE winds at 6-10 mph. Weak seabreeze arriving around 4 pm switching winds to the east with a few gusts up to 15 mph.			
7. General Safety Message Keep your guard up for changing conditions and react accordingly. Maintain situational awareness at all times. Think ahead and have a contingency plan. Know escape routes and safety zones. <p style="text-align: center;"><u>Road Construction Alert</u></p> The Department of Transportation has advised us that road construction is scheduled for the section of Hwy. 441 between Hwy. 90 and the junction with Hwy. 100A beginning on Tuesday May 15. Traffic delays can be expected in this area over the next several days. If you need to travel to Deep Creek, it is advisable to turn right off Hwy. 90 onto Hwy. 100A just past the airport (as you enter Lake City from the east)and travel Hwy. 100A to Hwy. 441 and then North on Hwy. 441 to Deep Creek. This route will avoid the construction area. You can also access Hwy. 441 from I-10 and then North to Deep Creek.

WEATHER FORECAST

Tony Edwards – Incident Meteorologist

Bugaboo Incident NF in Florida/Florida Div. of Forestry Forecast #18 5/19/2007 Day

WEATHER DISCUSSION: - High pressure will sit over the Tennessee Valley into early next week as an unseasonably dry airmass sets up over north Florida. Relative humidity will spend several hours below 35% this afternoon, prompting a RED FLAG WARNING, and low afternoon relative humidity will continue through at least Tues.

WEATHER FORECAST: *Red Flag Warning in Effect from 1 pm to 7 pm Today for Low Relative Humidity*

GENERAL: Mostly sunny. Pockets of smoke early, especially near Deep creek and in Divisions AA & BB.

TEMPERATURES: Highs 82 to 85. **HUMIDITY:** minimum 26-32%.
24 HOUR TREND: 1 degree cooler **24 HOUR TREND:** 5% drier

20 FT WINDS: Northeast 6 to 10 mph. Weak seabreeze arriving around 4 pm switching winds to the east with a few gusts up to 15 mph.

STABILITY/INVERSION: Morning inversion mixing out by 0900, then mixing height rising to around 6000 ft. Transport winds northeast around 12 mph. Dispersion index 60.

HAINES INDEX: 5 or moderate potential for large plume dominated fire growth.

OUTLOOK FOR SATURDAY NIGHT SHIFT: Clear. Lows 50 to 54. Humidity recovering to around 95%. 20 ft winds from the east 1 to 3 mph.

EXTENDED FORECAST:

Sunday: Clear. Lows 50-54. Highs 84-87. Minimum RH 24-29%. East winds 4 to 8 mph.
Monday: Mostly clear. Lows 51-55. Highs 86-89. Minimum RH 27-32%. East winds 4 to 8 mph.
Tuesday: Partly cloudy. Lows 56-60. Highs 86-89. Minimum RS 30-35%. East to southeast winds 6 to 10.

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL FIRE BEHAVIOR:

Type of fire: <i>Wind-dominated surface</i>	FL – 10 ft to 13 feet
ROS – 77 to 133 chains per hour	SPOTTING – 0.5 to 0.8 miles
POI – 60%	CROWN – <i>Passive when distance between surface and aerial fuel < 22 ft with 10mph wind and active at 15 mph wind.</i>

SPECIFIC FIRE BEHAVIOR:

All Divisions: *Approximately .25 inches of precipitation fell over the burn area last evening. This may continue to diminish fire behavior within, and outside the fire area today. Although reduced, there is still potential for fire to spread outside the fire's perimeter. Interior fine fuels (1-hr) within a chain of the fire's perimeter are becoming scarce and this scarcity reduces the probability, but not the possibility that embers will cross the control line and find available fuel that supports fire. Links between surface and ladder fuels is almost severed. After drying, bay laurels and cypress will again support surface fire intense enough to scorch overstory, but generally will not support passive crowning (torching) of overstory trees.*

There is a possibility that pockets of heat near available fuel may still respond to wind and low relative humidity, become active, and throw embers into wind stream. However, the probability is low that some embers may cross control line. As desiccated pine needles falls to surface and accumulate, reburn potential increases. Thick root mat, with duff gives ground fire and opportunity to retain heat over an extended time period unless dug out. Berms contain burning vegetation will need to be spread out and mopped up accordingly.

Divisions AA/BB/CC: *There will be opportunities for burnout operations most of the operational period. Winds for NE will push against control lines aligned perpendicular to its direction of flow. Continue to watch for downwind ember wash and spot fire initiation.*

AIR OPERATIONS: *Dense smoke from plume may interfere with aircraft flexibility.*

SAFETY MESSAGE

SAFETY starts with *YOU*

Fire Order of the Day – Keep informed on fire weather conditions and forecasts.
Watch Out Situation – Unfamiliar with weather and local factors influencing fire behavior.

Major Hazards and Risks:

- **Driving** – Drive defensively with lights on at all times. Maintain distance between vehicles, anticipate oncoming traffic, and always fasten your seatbelt. Use spotters when backing up especially with heavy equipment/engines.
- **Air Operations** – Insure ground personnel maintain safe distance during retardant or water drops. Maintain good communications with ground forces and aircraft in your area.
- **Dozer Operations** – Insure safety zones and escape routes are established and maintain communications with other ground units and aircraft. Avoid plowing in the swamps and bays.
- **Weather** – Red flag conditions will be possible for the next several days. Insure that escape routes and safety zones are known and communicated to all personnel on the line.
- **Fatigue/dehydration/personal welfare** – Take care of yourself by getting adequate rest and eating properly. Stay hydrated – if you are not urinating every 3 hours you are not drinking enough fluids. Remember to factor in cumulative fatigue into operational plans.

Fatigue – fatigued people perform poorly, behave carelessly, tolerate greater errors, and become inattentive. They display decreased motivation, increased irritability, and low morale. Fatigued employees are a hazard in most operations. Leaders should watch for behavior changes that indicate employees are fatigued and stressed. Increase rest breaks, and make adjustments in assignment where possible to reduce impacts of physically demanding tasks.

Communications:

- All firefighters are responsible for communicating hazards to others and to brief others as needed.
- Insure radio frequencies are confirmed and known to all personnel
- Provide update on any situation change
- Sound alarm early, not late
