Any injuries or illnesses should first be reported to Division Supervisors. Division Supervisors will notify line Safety Officer and Communications Unit with type of illness/injury and exact location. Communications will clear the air for emergency traffic only and notify Nightshift Safety Officer and EMT for advice for further care. If an air medical helicopter is used within the fire perimeter, Communications should notify the air operations director and helibase. When meeting point has been arranged with rescue or ambulance, personnel and patient need to remain at that location.

### **DEMOBILIZATION PROCESS**

THE DEMOBILIZATION PROCESS WILL BE ACCELERATED WITH THE FOLLOWING STEPS TAKING PLACE.

- 1. CHECK WITH DEMOB THREE (3) DAYS IN ADVANCE OF ANNOUNCED DATES TO MAKE CERTAIN OF ACCURACY ON DEMOB DATE.
- 2. MAKE CERTAIN TO HAVE ALL YOUR CTR'S TURNED IN THE DAY BEFORE YOU DEMOB, THEN THE TIME UNIT WILL HAVE ONLY THE LAST SHIFT TO ENTER INTO THE SYSTEM MAKING CHECKING OUT MORE EFFICIENT AND FASTER.
- 3. IF YOU REQUIRE A FLIGHT FOR TRAVEL TO YOUR HOME UNIT, TRAVEL ARRANGEMENTS WILL HAVE TO BE MADE AT LEAST 48 HOURS IN ADVANCE OF ACTUALLY BEING DEMOBED.
- 4. AFTER YOUR LAST SHIFT OBTAIN AN EVALUATION FROM YOUR SUPERVISOR.
- 5. NO PERSON SHALL BE RELEASED PRIOR TO OBTAINING ADEQUATE REST AS PROVIDED FOR BY AGENCY RULES AND POLICY. RESOURCES THAT ARE REASSIGNED WILL BE RELEASED THE MORNING AFTER THEIR LAST SHIFT. LOCAL RESOURCES RETURNING HOME WILL BE RELEASED AFTER SHIFT IF THEY CAN ARRIVE HOME BEFORE 2200.
- 6. ON THE DAY FOR YOUR DESIGNATED DEMOB, PLEASE REPORT TO THE DEMOB UNIT IN THE ICP AND PICK UP DEMOB FORM.
- 7. REPORT TO THE DESIGNATED UNITS AS LISTED ON THE DEMOB FORM.
- 8. RETURN TO DEMOB WHEN YOU HAVE COMPLETED CHECKOUT AT ALL UNITS.
- 9. IF YOU HAVE BEEN SUCCESSFUL IN BEING DEMOBED, THE INCIDENT COMMANDER AND STAFF WISH YOU A GOODBY AND TO HAVE A SAFE TRIP HOME.

CROWN – Passive when distance between surface and aerial fuel is less than 19 ft (<2100), then diminishing to a surface fire (>2100), respectively.

### **SPECIFIC FIRE BEHAVIOR:**

<u>All Divisions:</u> Interior fine fuels (1-hr) within a chain of the fire's perimeter are becoming scarce and this scarcity reduces the <u>probability</u>, but not the <u>possibility</u>, that embers may cross the control line and find available fuel that supports fire. This probability increases as desiccated pine needles fall to surface, accumulate, and increase reburn potential.

Links between surface and latter fuels are almost severed. There is the <u>possibility</u> that pockets of heat near available fuel may still respond to wind and low relative humidity, become active, and throw embers into wind stream. However, the <u>probability</u> is low that some embers may cross control line, but a <u>possibility</u> exists. Thick root mats, with duff, give ground fire an opportunity to retain heat over an extended time period, or interact with recently deposited pine needles, unless dug out.

Berms containing burning vegetation will need to be spread out and mopped up accordingly.

Bay laurels and cypress may support surface fire intense enough to scorch overstory, but generally will not support passive crowning (torching) of overstory trees.

AIR OPERATIONS: Until dark, there should be no interference by fire or smoke if aircraft are needed.

### Major Hazards and Risks:

- ➤ **Driving** Drive defensively, and watch for wildlife crossing roads at night. Obey all traffic regulations and speed limits. Maintain safe distance between vehicles and anticipate oncoming traffic. Use spotters when backing up. Evacuations have been lifted so be alert for local residents.
- ➤ Animal Hazards snakes are being seen in greater numbers and are especially active at night. With the cool nighttime temperatures beware of snakes coming out onto the roadways be alert when you step out of your vehicle and when working at night. Don't leave garbage and food scraps on the line so that animals will not be attracted and become a nuisance or a danger to personnel.
- Fatigue/personal welfare Take care of yourself by getting adequate rest and eating properly. Remember to account for long term, cumulative fatigue when planning operations.
- ➤ Complacency Stay vigilant and expect the unexpected. It is at this stage of the fire that people will become complacent and let their guard down. Maintain your situational awareness regardless of your assignment.

Remember that night time operations are a tactical watch out situation – maintain crew and personnel accountability!

Fatigue – monitor personnel for signs of cumulative fatigue. Research has shown that after 2300 the probability that people will lapse into sleep increases dramatically. Otherwise normally-functioning employees may suffer from short, intermittent episodes of fatigue, especially when sleep deprived. These episodes are characterized by very brief lapses in the performance of tasks during which details are missed, accuracy is impaired, and/or performance is slowed.
