Know escape routes and safety zones.</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><u>Road Construction Alert</u></p> <p>The Department of Transportation has advised us that road construction is scheduled for the section of Hwy. 441 between Hwy. 90 and the junction with Hwy. 100A beginning on Monday May 21. Traffic delays can be expected in this area. If you need to travel to Deep Creek, it is advisable to turn right off Hwy. 90 onto Hwy. 100A just past the airport (as you enter Lake City from the east)and travel Hwy. 100A to Hwy. 441 and then North on Hwy. 441 to Deep Creek. This route will avoid the construction area. You can also access Hwy. 441 from I-10 and then North to Deep Creek.</p>

WEATHER FORECAST Tony Edwards – Incident Meteorologist
Bugaboo Incident NF in Florida/Florida Div. of Forestry Forecast #20 5/20/2007 Day

WEATHER DISCUSSION: - High pressure will continue to sit to our north bringing an unseasonably dry airmass to north Florida through the early part of the week. Relative humidity will spend several hours below 35% this afternoon, prompting a Red Flag Warning. The low afternoon relative humidity will continue through at least Tuesday, before moisture levels start to increase from mid week on.

WEATHER FORECAST: - **Red Flag Warning in Effect from noon to 7 pm Today for Low Relative Humidity**

GENERAL: Sunny. Pockets of smoke early, especially near Deep Creek and in Divisions AA and BB.

TEMPERATURES: Lows 83 to 87. **HUMIDITY:** minimum 22-82%
24 HOUR TREND: 2 degrees warmer. **24 HOUR TREND:** 4% drier

20 FT WINDS: East 4 to 8 mph

STABILITY/INVERSION: Morning inversion mixing out by 0900, then mixing height rising to around 5500 ft. Transport winds east around 10 mph. Dispersion index 40.

HAINES INDEX: 5 or moderate potential for large plume dominated fire growth.

OUTLOOK FOR Sunday NIGHT SHIFT: Clear and cool. Lows 50 to 54. Humidity recovering to around 100%. 20 ft winds from the southeast 3 to 5 mph early, becoming calm.

EXTENDED FORECAST:

Monday: Mostly clear. Lows 50-54. Highs 86-89. Minimum RH 25-30%. East winds 4 to 8 mph.

Tuesday: Partly cloudy. Lows 53-57. Highs 86-89. Minimum RH 30-35%. East winds 6 to 10 mph.

Wednesday: Partly cloudy with a 20% chance for an afternoon shower or thunderstorm. Lows 58-62. Highs 84-87. Minimum RH 33-38%. East winds 6 to 12 mph.

Thursday through Saturday: Partly cloudy with scattered afternoon and evening thunderstorms. Lows 60-65. Highs 84-89. Winds 10 mph or less from the east through the period.

GENERAL FIRE BEHAVIOR (outside fire perimeter):

Type of fire: <i>Wind-dominated surface</i>	FL – 9 feet
ROS – 62 chains per hour	SPOTTING – 0.4 miles
POI – 90%	ERC - 40 – Extreme (Consult pocket card for local fire behavior thresholds)

CROWN – Passive when distance between surface and aerial fuel < 19 ft with 1 0mph wind.

SPECIFIC FIRE BEHAVIOR:

All Divisions: Interior fine fuels (1-hr) within a chain of the fire’s perimeter are becoming scarce and scarcity reduces the probability, but not the possibility, that embers will cross the control line and find available fuel that supports fire. This probability will increase as desiccated pine needles fall to surface, accumulate, and increase reburn potential.

Links between surface and latter fuels are almost severed. There is a possibility that pockets of heat near available fuel (i.e., recently deposited pine needles) may respond to wind and low relative humidity, become active, reinitiate torching, and throw embers into wind field. Although, the probability is low that embers will cross control line, a possibility exists.

Thick root mats, with duff, give ground fire an opportunity to retain heat over an extended time period, or interact with recently deposited pine needles, unless dug out.

Berms containing burning vegetation need to be spread out and mopped up accordingly.

After drying, peat under bay laurels and cypress may again support surface fire intense enough to scorch overstory, but generally will not support passive crowning (torching) of overstory trees.

AIR OPERATIONS: Dense smoke from smoke and fog may interfere with early morning aircraft use.

SAFETY IS EVERYONE'S JOB, MAKE IT YOUR PRIORITY!

Fire Order of the Night – *Know what your fire is doing at all times.*
Watch Out Situation – *Safety zones and escape routes not identified.*

Major Hazards and Risks:

- **Driving** – Drive defensively, with lights on at all times. Maintain safe distance between vehicles, anticipate oncoming traffic, and always fasten your seatbelt. Use spotters when backing up especially with heavy equipment/engines. Beware increased public traffic on Hwy 441.
- **Wildlife** – Be alert for alligators, snakes, bears, and other critters out there that can hurt you- be especially vigilant around any water. Don't feed the wildlife and make sure all garbage and food scraps are removed from the line.
- **Fatigue/personal welfare** – Take care of yourself by getting adequate rest and eating properly. It has been a long spring fire season so far and appears we will continue right on into the summer season. Watch for cumulative fatigue effects on personnel.
- **Complacency** – Stay vigilant and expect the unexpected. It is at this stage of the fire that people will become complacent and let their guard down. Maintain LCES at all times.
- **Weather** – Red flag conditions will be possible for the next several days. Insure that escape routes and safety zones are known and communicated to all personnel on the line.

REMEMBER – One of the common denominators of Fire Behavior on Tragedy Fires: Most fires are innocent in appearance before unexpected shifts in wind direction and/or speed results in flare-ups or extreme fire behavior. Tragedies have even occurred during the mop up stage. **Look Up, Look Down, Look Around.**
