Provide containment and control resources adequate for a nominal threat of escape. Rehab of control lines and mitigate impacts to natural and cultural resources adequate for returning management of the incident to the district. Excess supplies as well as trash will be removed from the line.

Provide for safety of fire suppression forces assigned to the Florida Bugaboo Wildfire, and the general public, by adhering to LCES, work/rest guidelines, and maintaining public awareness of risks to the community. 2. Maintain and improve relationships with all cooperators, adjacent landowners including GOAL organization and the affected communities, local government and emergency management officials. Involve them in the planning process, and keep them informed on all fire activities. 3. Provide training opportunities for State, Federal, and Local governments and cooperators in the areas of Incident Command and Fire Management. 4. Manage the assigned fire and any new starts delegated to the team using unified command in a manner consistent with the Florida Division of Forestry and the U. S. Forest Service fire management policies. 5. Provide a strong commitment to cost containment.

Maintain suppression resources to a level manageable by a Type III organization that will provide continued patrol, mop up and rehab on the Florida Bugaboo Fire and support local agency needs.			
7. Human Resource Policy			
<p>This Type 3 Organization is committed to a “zero tolerance” policy against inappropriate behavior during incident operations. We expect an attitude of mutual respect for all Incident personnel and the public we serve. Any form of harassment, discriminatory practices, or disrespectful behavior will not be tolerated and will be dealt with appropriately. Illegal drug use or other illegal activities will not be tolerated and will be turned over to local law enforcement authorities. Alcohol is strictly prohibited from the fire camp and all other incident locations. Violation of these standards of conduct can result in prompt dismissal from the incident.</p> <p>Individuals who are aware of any inappropriate behavior of incident personnel should tell their supervisor.</p>

- 7. REPORT TO THE DESIGNATED UNITS AS LISTED ON THE DEMOB FORM.**
- 8. RETURN TO DEMOB WHEN YOU HAVE COMPLETED CHECKOUT AT ALL UNITS.**
- 9. WHEN YOU HAVE BEEN SUCCESSFULLY DEMOBED, THE INCIDENT COMMANDERS AND TEAMS WISH YOU A SAFE TRIP HOME. THANK YOU AND GOOD-BYE.**

Major Hazard and Risks:

➤ **Thunderstorm Safety**

➤ **Dehydration and General Health**

➤ Logging salvage operations and road maintenance continues. Slow down and give these machines a wide berth when passing. Watch the road surfaces. Avoid standing water and soft shoulders. By reducing your speed—you'll be safer and not rip up the forest roads too.

➤ Expect thunderstorms with down drafts, high winds and lightning to occur everyday. Watch and know the expected weather; communicate any significant change at once to everyone and seek shelter until the threat passes.

➤ The temperature is raising and the RH is too. Pace yourself and drink at least 1 liter of fluid/hour. Take frequent breaks. Watch your overall health by avoiding "community" food/drinks", getting proper rest and keep your hands clean.

STANDARD FIREFIGHTING ORDERS

1. Keep informed on fire weather conditions & forecasts
2. Know what your fire is doing at all times
3. Base all actions on current & expected behavior of the fire
4. Identify escape routes & safety zones, and make them known
5. Post lookouts when there is possible danger
6. Be alert. Keep calm. Think clearly. Act decisively.
7. Maintain prompt communications with your forces, your supervisor and adjoining forces.
8. Give clear instructions and insure they are understood.
9. Maintain control of your forces at all times.
10. Fight fire aggressively, having provided for safety first.
