- 6. ON THE DAY FOR YOUR DESIGNATED DEMOB, PLEASE REPORT TO THE DEMOB UNIT IN THE ICP AND PICK UP DEMOB FORM.
- 7. REPORT TO THE DESIGNATED UNITS AS LISTED ON THE DEMOB FORM.
- 8. RETURN TO DEMOB WHEN YOU HAVE COMPLETED CHECKOUT AT ALL UNITS.
- 9. WHEN YOU HAVE BEEN SUCCESSFULLY DEMOBED, THE INCIDENT COMMANDERS AND TEAMS WISH YOU A SAFE TRIP HOME. THANK YOU AND GOOD-BYE.

- > Your footing will be a source of concern for the next few days until it dries out some. Use a three-point grip for safety when you are getting on and off equipment. Step over rather than on logs.
- > Expect the fire & wind weakened, drought ridden trees to be further undermined by the recent rain. Post lookouts and watchout for hazard trees. Avoid and flag them. Push over/fell as necessary.
- > Drive cautiously with your headlights "on". Give yourself extra room to stop. The roads may still be wet or hold standing water in many areas. The forest roads will be slippery with mud. This will require more time for you to stop.

STANDARD FIREFIGHTING ORDERS

- 1. Keep informed on fire weather conditions & forecasts
- 2. Know what your fire is doing at all times
- 3. Base all actions on current & expected behavior of the fire
- 4. Identify escape routes & safety zones, and make then known
- 5. Post lookouts when there is possible danger
- 6. Be alert. Keep calm. Think clearly. Act decisively.
- 7. Maintain prompt communications with your forces, your supervisor and adjoining forces.
- 8. Give clear instructions and insure they are understood.
- 9. Maintain control of your forces at all times.
- 10. Fight fire aggressively, having provided for safety first.
