Provide for safety of fire suppression forces assigned to the Florida Bugaboo Wildfire, and the general public, by adhering to LCES, work/rest guidelines, and maintaining public awareness of risks to the community. 2. Maintain and improve relationships with all cooperators, adjacent landowners including GOAL organization and the affected communities, local government and emergency management officials. Involve them in the planning process, and keep them informed on all fire activities. 3. Provide training opportunities for State, Federal, and Local governments and cooperators in the areas of Incident Command and Fire Management. 4. Manage the assigned fire and any new starts delegated to the team using unified command in a manner consistent with the Florida Division of Forestry and the U. S. Forest Service fire management policies. 5. Provide a strong commitment to cost containment.

Scale back suppression resources to a level manageable by a Type III organization that will provide continued patrol, mop up and rehab on the Florida Bugaboo Fire and support local agency needs.			
7. Human Resource Policy			
<p>The National Incident Management Organization (NIMO) Atlanta Team is committed to a “zero tolerance” policy against inappropriate behavior during incident operations. We expect an attitude of mutual respect for all Incident personnel and the public we serve. Any form of harassment, discriminatory practices, or disrespectful behavior will not be tolerated and will be dealt with appropriately. Illegal drug use or other illegal activities will not be tolerated and will be turned over to local law enforcement authorities. Alcohol is strictly prohibited from the fire camp and all other incident locations. Violation of these standards of conduct can result in prompt dismissal from the incident.</p> <p>Individuals who are aware of any inappropriate behavior of incident personnel should tell their supervisor or contact the Human Resource Specialist.</p>

Air Operations: Morning smog should burn off by 9 AM **Safety:** Heavier fuels and live fuels are still very dry. Watch for hot stump holes and muck pockets

- The rain will give us a short and needed rest. However, the drought conditions are so severe that extreme fire behavior can reoccur soon. Keep your guard up and pay close attention to your local situation and weather. Remember and practice LCES on every assignment.
- Many of you will travel home soon. Follow your itinerary and exercise good judgment. If your plans are interrupted, contact your home unit &/or coordination center.
- How complacent are you and your crew? Do you "forget" to wear your seat belt? Did you backhaul everything off the line? Have you checked the condition of your vehicle before the ride home? Being recognized as a professional firefighter means you will not accept complacency from yourself or others around you.

STANDARD FIREFIGHTING ORDERS

1. Keep informed on fire weather conditions & forecasts
2. Know what your fire is doing at all times
3. Base all actions on current & expected behavior of the fire
4. Identify escape routes & safety zones, and make them known
5. Post lookouts when there is possible danger
6. Be alert. Keep calm. Think clearly. Act decisively.
7. Maintain prompt communications with your forces, your supervisor and adjoining forces.
8. Give clear instructions and insure they are understood.
9. Maintain control of your forces at all times.
10. Fight fire aggressively, having provided for safety first.
