- 6. ON THE DAY FOR YOUR DESIGNATED DEMOB, PLEASE REPORT TO THE DEMOB UNIT IN THE ICP AND PICK UP DEMOB FORM.
- 7. REPORT TO THE DESIGNATED UNITS AS LISTED ON THE DEMOB FORM.
- 8. RETURN TO DEMOB WHEN YOU HAVE COMPLETED CHECKOUT AT ALL UNITS.
- 9. WHEN YOU HAVE BEEN SUCCESSFULLY DEMOBED, THE INCIDENT COMMANDERS AND TEAMS WISH YOU A SAFE TRIP HOME. THANK YOU AND GOOD-BYE.

The Best Thing You Can Do To Avoid Lightning Danger Is Learn And Practice Good Lightning Safety!

No Place Outside Is Safe Near A Thunderstorm!

The '30-30 Rule' Offers The Best Lightning Safety Guidance For The General Public. When You See Lightning, Count The Time Until You Hear Thunder. If That Is 30 Seconds Or Less, The Thunderstorm Is Close Enough To Be Dangerous – Seek Shelter (if you can't see the lightning, just hearing the thunder is a good back-up rule). Wait 30 Minutes Or More After The Lightning Flash Before Leaving Shelter.

A House, Or Other Fully Enclosed Substantially Constructed Building, Offers Your Best Protection Against Lightning ("substantially constructed" means it has wiring and plumbing). But Stay Away From Telephones, Electrical Appliances, And Plumbing. Don't Watch Lightning From Windows Or Doorways. Inner Rooms Are Generally Safer.

A Car With A Metal Roof And Sides Is Your Second Best Protection Against Lightning. As In A House, Don't Touch Any Conducting Paths Leading Outside. It Is The Metal Shell That Protects You, **Not** The Rubber Tires.

Lightning Is The #1 Weather Killer In Florida -- Killing More Than All Other Weather Sources Combined!

The Odds Of An Individual Being Killed By Lightning Each Year In The U.S. Is About 3 Million-To-One -- If You're An Average Person, In An Average Location, With Average Outside Activities, And Average Lightning Safety Behavior. That's About 35,000-To-One Over A life Time, And About 3,000-To-One Of Being Seriously Affected By A Family Member Or Friend Being Killed By Lightning. <u>WEATHER DISCUSSION:</u> Surface high pressure will continue south of the region while an upper level disturbance moves across the fire area today. Some storms may be strong with gusty winds and small hail. Heavy rain also possible. Chance of rain 50 percent.

Highs in the mid 90s. East winds 5 to 10 mph.



SAFETY MESSAGE

June 5, 2007 0700-0700

Major Hazard and Risks:

- > Weather
- > Wet Areas
- > Hand Washing
- > All this week thunderstorms, down drafts and lighting may occur. Stay aware of the weather. If T-cells develop or you see lightning, report it and seek shelter. Remember down drafts can be very strong and drop snags and trees. Lighting can strike up to several miles away and in clear skies.
- > The water we received is great. However, it is permitting snakes and other critters to reclaim their natural habitats. Beware you may encounter slithering critters.
- > Sure you wash your hands after you sneeze into them, but we've heard reports that some folks are reaching into the drinks coolers after working the fold-a-tanks, in standing water, etc, and not washing their hands. If you can't wash your hands with soap and water after such activity at least use hand sanitizer often.

STANDARD FIREFIGHTING ORDERS

- 1. Keep informed on fire weather conditions & forecasts
- 2. Know what your fire is doing at all times
- 3. Base all actions on current & expected behavior of the fire
- 4. Identify escape routes & safety zones, and make then known
- 5. Post lookouts when there is possible danger
- 6. Be alert. Keep calm. Think clearly. Act decisively.
- 7. Maintain prompt communications with your forces, your supervisor and adjoining forces.
- 8. Give clear instructions and insure they are understood.
- 9. Maintain control of your forces at all times.
- 10. Fight fire aggressively, having provided for safety first.


