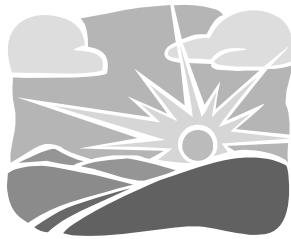

<p>5. General Control Objectives for the incident (include alternatives)</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Provide for the safety of fire suppression forces assigned to the Florida Bugaboo Wildfire, and the general public, by adhering to the "Standard Firefighting Orders", following work/rest guidelines, and maintaining public awareness of risks to the community. 2. Maintain and improve relationships with all cooperators, adjacent landowners, including the GOAL organization and the affected communities, local government, and emergency management officials. Involve them in the planning process, and keep them informed on all fire activities. 3. Provide training opportunities for State, Federal, and Local governments and cooperators, in the areas of Incident Command and Fire Management. 4. Manage the assigned fire and any new starts delegated to the team using unified Command, in a manner consistent with the Florida Division of Forestry and the U.S. Forest Service fire management policies, providing support in Planning, Logistics, and Initial Attack as needed. 5. Provide for a strong commitment to cost containment.

<p>7. General Safety Message</p> <p>Keep up your guard for changing conditions, and react accordingly. Maintain situational awareness at all times. Think ahead and have a contingency plan. Know escape routes and safety zones.</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><u>Road Construction Alert</u></p> <p>The Department of Transportation has road construction scheduled for the section of Hwy. 441 north of Hwy. 90 to Hwy. 100A. Traffic delays can be expected. For travel to Deep Creek from the ICP, it is advisable to turn right off Hwy. 90 onto Hwy. 100A just past the airport (as you enter Lake City from the east). Travel 100A to 441 and then North on 441 to Deep Creek. You can also access 441 from I-10 and then North to Deep Creek.</p>

Fuels are still very dry so if a fire gets rolling, expect fire behavior to be similar to that predicted by the FM 4 – Very Heavy Rough. KBDI at the Olustee RAWS station moved over 700.

Daytime-

Fires should behave as predicted by FM 7 or FM 9 until intensity builds. Fires over the past several weeks have burned with behavior best predicted by FM 4. The 3 "C's" (copperheads, coral snakes and cottonmouths) & 3 "R's" (timber, pygmy and eastern diamond rattlesnakes), gators (not those from the U of FL), bears are to be left alone. No feeding, no touching and no hassling any kind of wildlife. *They're not friendly and will hurt you.*
- Start replacing your fluids before you leave camp. Consume at least 1liter/hr on the line or more depending upon your work load. Alternate water with a sports drink. Avoid soda and "energy" drinks.
- This Memorial Day weekend will bring visitors to the forest and more drivers on the roadways. Heads-up for these additional folks. Be courteous and take a moment to explain what has happened and what they can do to be wildfire safe.

STANDARD FIREFIGHTING ORDERS

1. Keep informed on fire weather conditions & forecasts
2. Know what your fire is doing at all times
3. Base all actions on current & expected behavior of the fire
4. Identify escape routes & safety zones, and make them known
5. Post lookouts when there is possible danger
6. Be alert. Keep calm. Think clearly. Act decisively.
7. Maintain prompt communications with your forces, your supervisor and adjoining forces.
8. Give clear instructions and insure they are understood.
9. Maintain control of your forces at all times.
10. Fight fire aggressively, having provided for safety first.
