Maintain and improve relationships with all cooperators, adjacent landowners, including the GOAL organization and the affected communities, local government, and emergency management officials. Involve them in the planning process, and keep them informed on all fire activities. 3. Provide training opportunities for State, Federal, and Local governments and cooperators, in the areas of Incident Command and Fire Management. 4. Manage the assigned fire and any new starts delegated to the team using unified Command, in a manner consistent with the Florida Division of Forestry and the U.S. Forest Service fire management policies, providing support in Planning, Logistics, and Initial Attack as needed. 5. Provide for a strong commitment to cost containment.

DEMOBILIZATION PROCESS

Florida Bugaboo Fire

THE DEMOBILIZATION PROCESS WILL BE ACCELERATED WITH THE FOLLOWING STEPS TAKING PLACE.

- 1. CHECK WITH DEMOB THREE (3) DAYS IN ADVANCE OF ANNOUNCED DATES TO MAKE CERTAIN OF ACCURACY ON DEMOB DATE.**
- 2. MAKE CERTAIN TO HAVE ALL YOUR CTR'S TURNED IN THE DAY BEFORE YOU DEMOB, THEN THE TIME UNIT WILL HAVE ONLY THE LAST SHIFT TO ENTER INTO THE SYSTEM MAKING CHECKING OUT MORE EFFICIENT AND FASTER.**
- 3. IF YOU REQUIRE A FLIGHT FOR TRAVEL TO YOUR HOME UNIT, TRAVEL ARRANGEMENTS WILL HAVE TO BE MADE AT LEAST 48 HOURS IN ADVANCE OF ACTUALLY BEING DEMOBED.**
- 4. AFTER YOUR LAST SHIFT OBTAIN AN EVALUATION FROM YOUR SUPERVISOR.**
- 5. NO PERSON SHALL BE RELEASED PRIOR TO OBTAINING ADEQUATE REST AS PROVIDED FOR BY AGENCY RULES AND POLICY. RESOURCES THAT ARE REASSIGNED WILL BE RELEASED THE MORNING AFTER THEIR LAST SHIFT. LOCAL RESOURCES RETURNING HOME WILL BE RELEASED AFTER SHIFT IF THEY CAN ARRIVE HOME BEFORE 2200.**
- 6. ON THE DAY FOR YOUR DESIGNATED DEMOB, PLEASE REPORT TO THE DEMOB UNIT IN THE ICP AND PICK UP DEMOB FORM.**
- 7. REPORT TO THE DESIGNATED UNITS AS LISTED ON THE DEMOB FORM.**
- 8. RETURN TO DEMOB WHEN YOU HAVE COMPLETED CHECKOUT AT ALL UNITS.**
- 9. IF YOU HAVE BEEN SUCCESSFUL IN BEING DEMOBED, THE INCIDENT COMMANDER AND STAFF WISH YOU A GOODBY AND TO HAVE A SAFE TRIP HOME.**

WEATHER DISCUSSION: High pressure along the southeast Atlantic coast will continue through Tuesday. This will continue east flow over the fire area with little chance of rain.

WEATHER FORECAST – Monday:

WEATHER: Mostly Sunny with areas of smoke in the morning. Partly sunny in the afternoon.
TEMPERATURES: Highs 85-90...warmest on the west side. **24 HOUR TREND:** Similar.
HUMIDITIES: Min RH's 30% west side and 40% east side. **24 HOUR TREND:** Similar.
20 FT WINDS: Calm or Light Northeast winds early becoming east 5 to 10 mph with gusts to 20 mph in the afternoon.
STABILITY/INVERSION: Strong shallow inversion breaking 0900-1000L. Mixing heights 6000 ft. Transport winds East 20 mph. Dispersion index 70.

WEATHER FORECAST – Monday Night:

WEATHER: Clear to partly cloudy. Patchy smoke and fog late.
TEMPERATURES: Lows 55-60. **HUMIDITIES:** Max RH's 95-100%.
20 FT WINDS: East winds 5 to 10 mph with gusts to 20 mph becoming light and then calm after sunset.
STABILITY/INVERSION: Strong inversion developing. Dispersion index 5.

EXTENDED FORECAST:

Tuesday: Partly cloudy. Highs 85-90. Min RH's 30-40 percent. East winds 5 to 10 mph.

FIRE BEHAVIOR

General: Winds will again remain light to moderate today, BUT still with gusts at times. RH will dip down to near critical levels, so there may be a red flag warning issued either in the morning or during the day. Continue to watch for the increased chance for REBURN along the lines. Yesterday's new start burned at 40 ch/hr and burned similar to that predicted by the FM 4 – Very Heavy Rough model. KBDI at the Olustee (just south of fire) and Eddy (Division D) RAWS station moved over 700. And ERCs were at 37 at Eddy Olustee RAWS yesterday.

Daytime - Fires should behave as predicted in the FM 9 until intensity builds. Fires in unburned fuels will build quickly and demonstrate fire behavior best predicted by FM 4.

With winds (20' above ground) of 5-10 MPH with gusts and the predicted Temp. and RH, we could see the following fire behavior. (Same as yesterday)

The PROBABILITY OF IGNITION Daytime – 60-80% (depending on shading), Night-time 40 down to 10% at dawn. Spotting distances 0.1-0.2 average, with gusts it increases to 0.4 miles.

All Divisions: Watch for spots, flare ups and REBURN runs. There are trees that have fallen on most if not all divisions.

Air Operations: Morning smog should burn off by 9 AM

Safety: Heavier fuels and live fuels are still very dry. Watch for intense runs due to gusty winds. Watch for REBURN in all areas.

- Today logging salvage operations begin in earnest. Slow down and give them a wide berth when passing salvage areas. Remember, these areas are of concern because fire can return.
- By now you've notice there are many kinds of small critters that will bite, sting, stick, chew, web, and generally bother you although some are dangerous. Spray yourself especially at the opening to your clothing and a couple of times during the day with bug spray to help keep them off you. Consider "blousing" your pants legs into your boots.
- Most roads we travel are open. With this we are seeing more of the public on the roads we are working. Drive with your headlights on. Use your emergency lights when appropriate. Remember LEO is enforcing the speed limits with radar

STANDARD FIREFIGHTING ORDERS

1. Keep informed on fire weather conditions & forecasts
 2. Know what your fire is doing at all times
 3. Base all actions on current & expected behavior of the fire
 4. Identify escape routes & safety zones, and make them known
 5. Post lookouts when there is possible danger
 6. Be alert. Keep calm. Think clearly. Act decisively.
 7. Maintain prompt communications with your forces, your supervisor and adjoining forces.
 8. Give clear instructions and insure they are understood.
 9. Maintain control of your forces at all times.
 10. Fight fire aggressively, having provided for safety first.
