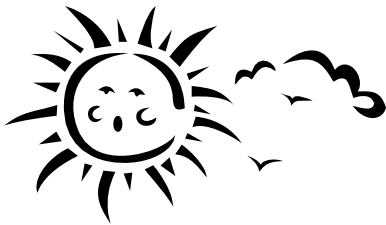


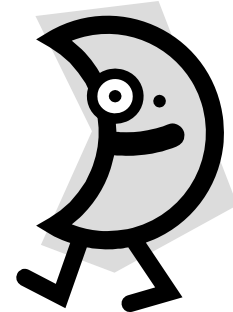

Provide for the safety of fire suppression forces assigned to the Florida Bugaboo Wildfire, and the general public, by adhering to the "Standard Firefighting Orders", following work/rest guidelines, and maintaining public awareness of risks to the community. 2. Maintain and improve relationships with all cooperators, adjacent landowners, including the GOAL organization and the affected communities, local government, and emergency management officials. Involve them in the planning process, and keep them informed on all fire activities. 3. Provide training opportunities for State, Federal, and Local governments and cooperators, in the areas of Incident Command and Fire Management. 4. Manage the assigned fire and any new starts delegated to the team using unified Command, in a manner consistent with the Florida Division of Forestry and the U.S. Forest Service fire management policies, providing support in Planning, Logistics, and Initial Attack as needed. 5. Provide for a strong commitment to cost containment.

WEATHER FORECAST

Bugaboo Incident NF in Florida/Florida Div. of Forestry Forecast #33 5/29/2007

WEATHER DISCUSSION: High pressure along the eastern seaboard will continue through Wednesday.

This will continue an east flow over the fire area with only little chance of rain. RH's could dip to 30 percent over Western portions of the fire area with durations below 35 percent less than 4 hours.

WEATHER FORECAST – Tuesday: Partly cloudy. Areas of smoke in the morning. A brief shower possible in the afternoon. Chance of measurable rain 10 percent.

TEMPERATURES: Highs 84-89. **24 HOUR TREND:** Similar.

HUMIDITIES: Min RH's 30-40% west side and 40-50% east side. **24 HOUR TREND:** Similar.

20 FT WINDS: Calm or Light winds early becoming east 5 to 10 mph with gusts to 20 mph in the afternoon.

STABILITY/INVERSION: Strong shallow inversion breaking 0900-1000L. Mixing heights 7000 ft. Transport winds East 20 mph. Dispersion index 70-75.

WEATHER FORECAST – Tuesday Night: Clear to partly cloudy. Areas of smoke late.

TEMPERATURES: Lows 57-62. **HUMIDITIES:** Max RH's 95-100%.

20 FT WINDS: East winds 5 to 10 mph with gusts to 20 mph diminishing after sunset.

STABILITY/INVERSION: Strong inversion developing. Dispersion index 5-6.

EXTENDED FORECAST:

Wednesday: Partly to mostly cloudy. A slight chance of showers. Highs 85-90. Min RH's 30-45%.

Winds becoming East 5 to 10 mph gusting to 20 mph in the afternoon.

Thursday and Friday: Partly cloudy. A slight chance of showers and thunderstorms. Lows in the lower 60s.

Highs 85 to 90. East winds 5 to 10 mph.

Saturday through Monday: A chance of showers and thunderstorms. Lows in the 60s. Highs in the upper 80s to lower 90s. Southeast winds 5 to 10 mph Saturday and southwest Sunday and Monday.

FIRE BEHAVIOR

Bugaboo Incident NF in Florida/Florida Div. of Forestry Forecast #33 5/29/2007

General: Winds will again remain light to moderate today, BUT still with gusts at times. RH will dip down to near critical levels, so there may be a red flag warning issued either in the morning or during the day. Continue to watch for the increased chance for REBURN along the lines.

KBDI at the Olustee (just south of fire) is 709 and ERC is 39. At the Eddy (Division A) RAWs station KBDI was 711 and ERCs is at 39 yesterday.

Daytime - Fires in reburn needles should behave as predicted in the FM 9 until intensity builds. Fires in unburned fuels will build quickly and demonstrate fire behavior best predicted by FM 4.

With winds (20' above ground) of 5-10 MPH with gusts and the predicted Temp. and RH, we could see the following fire behavior. (Same as yesterday, again)

The PROBABILITY OF IGNITION Daytime – 60-80% (depending on shading), Night-time 40 down to 10% at dawn. Spotting distances 0.1-0.2 average, with gusts it increases to 0.4 miles.

All Divisions: Watch for spots, flare ups and REBURN runs. There are trees that have fallen on most if not all divisions.

Air Operations: Morning smog should burn off by 9 AM

Safety: Heavier fuels and live fuels are still very dry. Watch for intense runs due to gusty winds. Watch for REBURN in all areas.

SAFETY MESSAGE

Major Hazard and Risks:

- **Driving on Old Suwanee Road**
- **Retardant Drops**
- **Common Denominators of Fire Behavior on Tragedy Fires**

- Have you noticed that Old Suwanee Road have telephone poles in the middle of it? Many of these poles have numerous scars from previous close encounters with log trucks and other vehicles — meaning it'll only take a slight jar to cause them to crash down.
- Get clear of the snags, limbs, etc and as far away as you can. Make sure vehicles are not under the drop zone. Working in an area covered by wet retardant is like trying to stand on slim.
- Many of you are working in small/quiet areas of this large fire and in light fuels. Occasional/elevated/shifting winds can cause things to pick up. Fire responding to vegetation/topographical conditions? If so, then know trigger points to re-evaluate strategy and tactics

STANDARD FIREFIGHTING ORDERS

1. Keep informed on fire weather conditions & forecasts
 2. Know what your fire is doing at all times
 3. Base all actions on current & expected behavior of the fire
 4. Identify escape routes & safety zones, and make them known
 5. Post lookouts when there is possible danger
 6. Be alert. Keep calm. Think clearly. Act decisively.
 7. Maintain prompt communications with your forces, your supervisor and adjoining forces.
 8. Give clear instructions and insure they are understood.
 9. Maintain control of your forces at all times.
 10. Fight fire aggressively, having provided for safety first.
