- 2. Know what your fire is doing at all times

- 3. Base all actions on current & expected behavior of the fire
- 4. Identify escape routes & safety zones, and make then known
- 5. Post lookouts when there is possible danger
- 6. Be alert. Keep calm. Think clearly. Act decisively.
- 7. Maintain prompt communications with your forces, your supervisor and adjoining forces.
- 8. Give clear instructions and insure they are understood.
- 9. Maintain control of your forces at all times.
- 10. Fight fire aggressively, having provided for safety first.

FIRE WEATHER WATCH

A Fire Weather Watch means that critical fire weather conditions are forecast to occur. The combination of strong winds, relative humidity below 35 per cent, and high temperatures in the upper 90S with heat indices approaching 100 this afternoon will create a high fire danger and rapid fire growth potential.

Scattered isolated thunderstorm development is expected this afternoon.

RED FLAG WARNING

Drier air advecting into the region with RH values below 35 per cent may result in RH values reaching critical levels Monday afternoon for around 4 to 6 hours. .

A Red Flag warning means that Critical Fire Weather conditions are either occurring now or will shortly. The combination of low RH and warm temperatures will create a high fire danger and rapid fire growth potential.
