Major I	Hazard and Risks:
	> Equipment Safety Maintenance
	> Rehab Safety
	> Complacency
>	Check all of your equipment daily with safety in mind. Things to look for include leaking hydraulic lines, fully charged fire extinguishers and pine needles in enclosed cab filters and air conditioning units.
>	Rehab is an important function of any fire assignment. Fire weakened trees, backing of equipment and transports, and traffic congestion, are but a few areas of concern. During your shift, identify at least one other safety concern and share it with the group during de-briefing. Lets all be safe out there.
>	Even though this fire is winding down, this is not a time for complacency.  Please remain focused on your assignment and maintain your situational awareness. Everyone has done an excellent job with safety on this incident.

#### STANDARD FIREFIGHTING ORDERS

- 1. Keep informed on fire weather conditions & forecasts
- 2. Know what your fire is doing at all times

Don't Stop Now!!

- 3. Base all actions on current & expected behavior of the fire
- 4. Identify escape routes & safety zones, and make then known
- 5. Post lookouts when there is possible danger
- 6. Be alert. Keep calm. Think clearly. Act decisively.
- 7. Maintain prompt communications with your forces, your supervisor and adjoining forces.
- 8. Give clear instructions and insure they are understood.
- 9. Maintain control of your forces at all times.
- 10. Fight fire aggressively, having provided for safety first.
