**4. Operational Period** – 06/17/2007 Sunday 0700-1900

#### 5. Incident End State

Provide contaninment and control resources adequate for a nominal threat of escape. Rehab of control lines and mitigate impacts to natural and cultural resources adequate for returning management of the incident to the district. Excess supplies as well as trash will be removed from the line.

#### 5. Incident Objectives

- 1. Provide for safety of fire suppression forces assigned to the Florida Bugaboo Wildfire, and the general public, by adhering to LCES, work/rest guidelines, and maintaining public awareness of risks to the community.
- Maintain and improve relationships with all cooperator, adjacent landowners including GOAL organization and the affected communities, local government and emergency management officials. Involve them in the planning process, and keep them informed on all fire activities.
- 3. Provide training opportunities for State, Federal, and Local governments and cooperators in the areas of Incident Command and Fire Management.
- 4. Manage the assigned fire and any new starts delegated to the team using unified command in a manner consistent with the Florida Division of Forestry and the U. S. Forest Service fire management policies.
- 5. Provide a strong commitment to cost containment.

#### 6. Strategy

Maintain suppression resources to a level manageable by a Type III organazation that will provide continued patrol, mop up and rehab on the Florida Bugaboo Fire and support local agency needs.

#### 7. Human Resource Policy

This Type 3 Organization is committed to a "zero tolerance" policy against inappropriate behavior during incident operations. We expect an attitude of mutual respect for all Incident personnel and the public we serve. Any form of harassment, discriminatory practices, or disrespectful behavior will not be tolerated and will be dealt with appropriately. Illegal drug use or other illegal activities will not be tolerated and will be turned over to local law enforcement authorities. Alcohol is strictly prohibited from the fire camp and all other incident locations. Violation of these standards of conduct can result in prompt dismissal from the incident.

Individuals who are aware of any inappropriate behavior of incident personnel should tell their supervisor.

Major Hazards and Risks:

<u>Complacency-Many hazards still exist; stay focused on the task at hand.</u> Dehydration-Continue to drink fluids. Supplement with Gatorade.

Hazard Trees-Check both green and burned trees for signs of weakness, rot and damaged roots.

Wildlife-Animals are moving back into areas being rehabbed watch for them on the roads as you drive. <u>Transportation-Drive defensively with lights on.</u>

<u>Heavy Equipment-Make sure the operator can see you approaching.</u>

Fire Order of the Day -Stay alert, keep calm, think clearly, act decisively

Narrative:

After a couple days of rehab, it is easy to become complacent, but many hazards still exist. Stay alert and focused

on the task at hand, whatever and wherever the assignment; in camp, while traveling or on the line.

Don't harass the snakes and gators.

### Symptoms & Signs of Heat Illness

*Heat Exhaustion: Victim will have cool, clammy skin; pale coloring; feel weak, dizzy and/or nauseous.* 

<u>Treatment – Have individual sit in shade or cool area;</u> administer fluids; loosen clothing and assure rest.

*Heat Stroke:* This is a medical emergency!! *Victim will have hot, dry, red skin and possible convulsions. These symptoms can progress to unconsciousness and death!* 

<u>Treatment – Immediately cool individual's body by</u> <u>pouring water over them, especially the head and upper</u> <u>body. Contact the medical unit. Monitor the victim and</u> <u>provide whatever medical support necessary. Placing ice</u> <u>around the neck, groin and armpits can help speed the</u> <u>cool down.</u>
