<b>Major Hazards and Risks: TRANSPORTATION, MOPUP, PERSONAL CARE</b>		
<p><b>Transportation -- Driving will continue to be a major hazard on the County Line Fire today.</b> Continue to be especially careful when driving on wet roads. Make sure everyone is wearing a seat belt and drive with lights on. <b>Drive defensively at all times, with the Wanee Festival this weekend, there will be a increase in traffic in and around Lake City.</b></p> <p><b>IA / Mopup – L.C.E.S.&gt;&gt; Pay attention to the small details concerning hazard around you</b> (Hazard trees, footing, eye care/goggles, poison ivy, snakes, critters, lifting and PPE). Small injuries may lead to major problems.</p> <p><b>Personal Care –</b>With the temperatures rising, <b>Drink lots of water.</b> If you are injured or start to feel ill get help immediately. It will help your recovery time.</p>

Brief others as needed.</li><li>2. Debrief your actions.</li><li>3. Communicate hazards to others.</li><li>4. Acknowledge messages.</li><li>5. Ask if you don't know.</li></ol> <p>In addition, all leaders of firefighters have the responsibility to provide complete briefings that include a clearly stated "Leaders Intent."</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Task = What is to be done</li><li>• Purpose = Why is it to be done</li><li>• End State = How it should look when done</li></ul>
