IA / Mopup – L.C.E.S.>> Pay attention to the small details concerning hazard around you (Hazard trees, footing, eye care/goggles, poison ivy, snakes, critters, lifting and PPE). Small injuries may lead to major problems.

Personal Care –With the temperatures rising, **Drink lots of water.** If you are injured or start to feel ill get help immediately. It will help your recovery time.

Watch Out Situation of the Day **Communication Responsibilities Distracted Driving** All firefighters have five communication responsibilities: 1. Brief others as needed. 2. Debrief your actions. 3. Communicate hazards to others. 4. Acknowledge messages. 5. Ask if you don't know. In addition, all leaders of firefighters have the responsibility to provide complete briefings that include a clearly stated "Leaders Intent." End Result! • Task = What is to be done • Purpose = Why is it to be done • End State = How it should look when done
