WEATHER DISCUSSION: High pressure to the ENE will continue to keep a southeasterly flow across the area today. The Gulf sea breeze will once again try to set up along the coast, and will slowly progress to the east. Moisture will continue to slowly increase. This will trend the Relative Humidity higher, but also allow for increasing chances of showers and thunderstorms. Today, the chances look to be closer to the burn area than yesterday. So, showers and storms may develop in the vicinity of the burn, then move to the north to northwest.

WEATHER FORECAST:

WEATHER: Sunny in the morning, then partly cloudy by midday. 40% chance of Showers and a 25% chance of a thunderstorm in the afternoon.

TEMPERATURES: Low around 69, High 94

HUMIDITY: Around 45%

20 FT WINDS: SE-SSE 8-12 mph, gusts to around 15 mph.

Dispersion: Good, around 55.

OUTLOOK FOR (next shift): Winds becoming light out of the southeast. Light fog is possible once again, mainly over canals and waterways. Inversion will set up around 9 to 10 pm. The LÖVRI will rise to 10 in the early morning. RH recoveries will be excellent, with RH 95-100%. A Low temperature of 68 for Wednesday Morning.

OUTLOOK FOR WEDNESDAY: 40% chance of showers and thunderstorms. High 91. Wind SSE 8-12

mph, gusts around 15 mph in the middle of the day. Winds will slowly subside through the afternoon. A weak Sea Breeze from the Gulf will try to turn winds more southerly in the late-afternoon. Minimum Relative Humidity: 45-50%. Dispersion: 55.

EXTENDED FORECAST: A cold front will move into North Florida and stall before it reaches South Florida. Winds will more southerly Thursday until the mid afternoon when they look to turn SSW through the evening hours. Winds will turn back to the SE by Friday morning. Also, the chances of showers and thunderstorms will continue to be 30-40% through at least Thursday.

FUEL ASSUMPTIONS: The major fuel types found on the fire are grass, shrub (palm/palmetto) and timber litter. Fire Behavior Prediction System Fuel models used are 3, 4, and 8. Live woody fuel moistures for are near 150, and live herbaceous is 100 or less. Cabbage Palms are good receptors for embers and also excellent initiators of spot fires.

WEATHER SUMMARY

Slight increase in moisture with temps in the mid 90's with a 40% chance of a shower and 25% chance of a possible thunderstorm. Temp in the mid 90's, RH-40-45 and winds SE-SSE 8-12 with gust to 15.

General Fire Behavior Forecast: The peak burn period will begin around 1200 and will continue through sunset. Fuel moistures are low and ignition of 10 and 100 hour fuels will take place and can create mop up and control problems. Spotting up to 1/3 mile is possible during the peak burn period primarily from brush fuels. Probability of ignition near 60%.

Specific:

PREDICTIONS FOR MOST ACTIVE TIME OF PEAK BURNING PERIOD

Fine Fuel Moisture: 7%, Probability of Ignition 60%.

Flame Length (Fl): Grass >10' Brush >15' and Timber Litter <2'

Rate of Spread (ROS): Grass (FM3) 40 to 70 chains/hour, brush (FM4) > 30 chains/hour, Timber Litter (FM8) < 5 chains/hr.

Flame Length (Fl): Grass >10' Brush >15' and Timber Litter <2'

Division A: Utilization of water will be needed for good mop-up of any residual smokes that could appear.

Division B: Residual heat from Sunday's burn out operations can still initiate spot fires west of the Clown camp. The rest of the division will remain quiet. Any spot across the line can grow to 50+ acres in FM3 and FM4 fuels in an hour.

Division Z: Sleepers from Sunday's burn out operations can still show up today. Any spot across the line can grow to 50+ acres in FM3 and FM4 fuels in an hour.

Initial Attack: Fire size within an hour can grow to 50+ acres in an hour in FM3 and FM4 fuels.

AIR OPERATIONS: Fog and smoke should dissipate by 0900.

FIRE BEHAVIOR SAFETY:

Fire Behavior changes can be dramatic as the fire burns from one fuel to another. This needs to be considered as you determine routes into any initial attack fire or spot.


The fire is much quieter now but one of the common denominators of tragedy fires is "... deceptively quiet areas of large fires". Weather conditions are becoming a little more active. Keep situational awareness in place throughout the entire operational period as your location changes.


Fatigue starts to affect an individual after only a few days. Follow the work/rest guidelines and mitigate longer shifts as soon as possible.

We are driving a lot of miles on major highways. Non-fire traffic won't pay sufficient attention to us so drive defensively at all times.

Pace yourself, drink plenty of fluids and be able to recognize the signs/symptoms of heat related injuries. Drink 4 times the amount of water to Gatorade type drinks.






