

WEATHER DISCUSSION: ... Near critical RH today for the area...

An upper ridge extends over the area during this period. Surface high pressure is centered off the North Carolina coast ridging across the south Georgia area. This high will become established over the Atlantic with light winds early in the week giving way to light onshore surface south to southeast winds from Monday to Tuesday. By late Tuesday deep layer moisture starts to build ahead of a surface front that resides well north of the area. This frontal system stalls during the week and in combination with upper level southwest flow, a rainband over the region develops from Wednesday through to the weekend.

WEATHER FORECAST SUNDAY:

WEATHER: Mostly sunny.
MAX TEMPERATURES: 90 to 95. (24 hour trend = up 3 degrees)
MIN HUMIDITY: 28 to 32 percent (24 hour trend = down around 3 percent)
20 FT WINDS: Light and variable winds in the morning then becoming east southeast and increasing to 6 to 10 mph with gusts to 15 mph in the afternoon.
STABILITY/INVERSION: Morning smoke and fog lifting around 1000 then smoke drifting westward.
Mixing heights around 7000 ft.
Dispersion Index 50. LAL 1.
TRANSPORT WINDS: East 10 to 12 mph.

WEATHER: Mostly clear
MIN TEMPERATURES: Low around 65.
MAX HUMIDITY: Recovery near 100 percent.

AVIATION "WATCH OUT" SITUATIONS

As part of risk management, especially during high activity fires, each aviation manager and employee should be asking questions.

- Is the flight necessary?
- Who is in charge?
- Are all hazards identified and have you made them known?
- Should the operation or the flight be stopped due to a change in conditions? Consider the following:
 - Communications
 - Confusion
 - Personnel
 - Weather
 - Turbulence
 - Conflicting priorities
- Is there a better way to do it?
- Are you driven by the task and sense of urgency?
- Can you justify your actions?
- Are there other aircraft in the area?
- Will the pilot accept the mission?
- Are any guidelines being ignored or policies being broken?
- Are communications getting tense?

Are you deviating from the assigned operation or flight?


