Protect key resources including threatened and endangered species and their habitat, over-night canoe shelters, and other resources. 5. Protect the integrity of the Okefenokee Wilderness. 6. WEATHER DISCUSSION:

The **main concern is:**

1. Shifting winds near showers and storms in the afternoon and into the evening.
2. Occasional lightning strikes possible in and near storms.

WEATHER FORECAST DAY SHIFT Saturday:

WEATHER: Mostly cloudy and hazy. A 30 percent chance of showers and/or thunderstorms.

MAX TEMPERATURES: 85-88 (24 hour trend = 2 deg lower)

MIN HUMIDITY: 33-36% (24 hour trend = 2-3% higher)

20 FT WINDS: Light southeast early increasing to 7 to 10 mph gusts to 14 mph in the afternoon.

STABILITY/INVERSION: Moderate inversion breaking by 1000. Mixing heights around 5000 ft. Dispersion Index around 50. Haines 4.

WEATHER FORECAST NIGHT SHIFT Saturday night:

WEATHER: Mostly cloudy with a 30 percent chance of showers and/or thunderstorms.

MIN TEMPERATURES: 64-67

MAX HUMIDITY: Recovery 75 percent near the fire and near 95 percent elsewhere.

20 FT WINDS: Southeast 7 to 10 mph in the evening...becoming southwest 4 to 7 mph after midnight.

STABILITY/INVERSION: No inversion. Smoke dispersion 7 to 10. Mixing heights near 1000 ft.

OUTLOOK FOR SUNDAY: Mostly cloudy becoming breezy. Isolated afternoon showers. High temperatures around 83. Minimum RH values 45 to 50%. Variable winds becoming Northeast 11 to 16 mph with gusts to 19 mph in the afternoon.

***Traffic:** Turn on headlights to be seen in smoke, haze. Wear seat belts. Evaluate the bridges you may want to cross. They may not be safe after all the heavy transports have crossed. The State Championship trap shoot competition is located in DIV EF and will run Friday through Sunday.

***Situational Awareness:** Be aware of the sea breeze and fire potential. With extreme conditions and fire behavior exhibited since this fire began, nothing can be taken for granted. **Be alert. Keep calm. Think clearly. Act decisively.**
