**WEATHER DISCUSSION:** Subtropical Storm Andrea off the Georgia coast will continue to weaken as it moves slowly southwest to the northeast Florida coast by Friday.

The main concern is:

1. Erratic wind shifts near showers and thunderstorms.
2. Occasional lightning strikes.

---

### **WEATHER FORECAST DAY SHIFT Thursday:**

**WEATHER:** Mostly cloudy. A 30 percent chance of showers and thunderstorms.

**MAX TEMPERATURES:** 79-82 (24 hour trend = 4 deg higher)

**MIN HUMIDITY:** 45-50 percent (24 hour trend ~ 5 percent lower)

**20 FT WINDS:** North to Northeast 5 to 10 mph in the morning becoming northeast 10 to 15 mph by afternoon.

**STABILITY/INVERSION:** Shallow early morning inversion around 500 ft dissipating by 0800. Mixing heights around 4800 ft in the afternoon. Dispersion Index around 26. Haines Index 3 (very low).

### **WEATHER FORECAST NIGHT SHIFT Thursday night:**

**WEATHER:** Partly cloudy. A 20 percent chance of showers. An isolated thunderstorm is possible.

**MIN TEMPERATURES:** 63-66. (24 hour trend = 3 deg higher)

**MAX HUMIDITY:** Recovery to 70 percent near the fire and around 85 percent elsewhere.

**20 FT WINDS:** Northeast to east decreasing to 5 to 10 mph in the evening. Becoming light and variable by midnight.

**STABILITY/INVERSION:** Inversion setting up to 1000 ft dissipating by 1000. Dispersion Index around 7.

---

**OUTLOOK FOR Friday:** Mostly cloudy with a 20 percent chance of showers. Areas of smoke and fog reducing visibilities to 2 miles or less in the morning. High temperatures 82 to 85. Minimum RH values 45 to 50 percent. Northeast wind at 5 to 10 mph becoming east 10 to 15 mph in the afternoon.

**\* Work/Rest:** Make sure you adhere to the 2:1 work/rest ratio. Several shifts have had to extend hours of operations. Supervisors must ensure that work/rest guidelines are followed.
