WEATHER DISCUSSION:

As of 8 pm yesterday, Tropical Storm Barry was forecast to remain a minimal tropical storm as it moves to the north-northeast, making landfall along the Florida gulf coast today. The remnants of Barry are then expected to continue to track to the north-northeast, moving across southeast Georgia this afternoon into this evening. The details of the forecast will vary significantly depending on the exact track that Barry takes, but significant rainfall, strong winds, and isolated tornadoes are all possible.

WEATHER FORECAST SATURDAY:

Tropical Storm Barry Tracking Over or West of Complex...

WEATHER: Windy. Rain, heavy at times, with embedded thunderstorms. Isolated tornadoes are possible. Chance of rain near 100 percent. Rainfall amounts 2 to 4 inches with locally higher amounts (through tonight).

MAX TEMPERATURES: Around 80. (24 hour trend = down 6 degrees) **MIN HUMIDITY:** 70 to 75 percent (24 hour trend = up 30 percent)

20 FT WINDS: Northeast to east 10 to 14 mph with gusts to 20 mph, increasing to 18 to 25 mph with gusts to 35 mph and shifting south then southwest late.

Tropical Storm Barry Tracking East of Complex...

WEATHER: Breezy. Rain, possibly heavy at times, with isolated embedded thunderstorms. Chance of rain 80 percent. Rainfall amounts 1.0 to 2.5 inches with locally higher amounts (through tonight).

MAX TEMPERATURES: Around 76. (24 hour trend = down 10 degrees)

MIN HUMIDITY: 63 to 68 percent (24 hour trend = up 23 percent)

20 FT WINDS: East-northeast 9 to 13 mph with gusts to 20 mph, becoming northeast 15 to 22 mph with gusts to 30 mph.

Tropical Storm Barry Tracking Over or West of Complex...

20 FT WINDS: North 9 to 13 mph with gusts to 20 mph, becoming northwest 5 to 9 mph after midnight.



INCIDENT EMERGENCY PLAN (IEP)

The goal of this Incident Emergency Plan (IEP) is to provide the guidelines necessary to Locate, Triage, Extricate, Treat and Transport accident Patients. The Division/Group Supervisor will initially oversee the emergency. Radio communication will be on the "Command Frequency". Names of injured or deceased individuals should not be given over the radio. Deceased individuals and their equipment are not to be moved, except to accomplish rescue work or to protect the health and safety of others. It is expected this organization will come from resources assigned within the Division or nearest adjoining forces.

DIVISION/GROUP SUPERVISOR

- Conduct Size-up of the Incident (Nature of Accident, Number/Type of Resources, Location)
- Coordinate "Line EMT" response to the accident (Utilize Closest EMT's).
- □ Begin "TRIAGE"
- □ Determine and initiate treatment and transportation needs
- ☐ Evaluate special needs (Law Enforcement, Heavy Rescue, Haz Mat)
- ☐ Coordinate with Air Attack for Air-Medical transportation needs
- ☐ Preserve the scene for accident investigation

MEDICAL GROUP SUPERVISOR (This position will be filled, only if needed)

- □ Supervise TRIAGE, Treatment and Transportation Unit Leaders.
- Place orders through Communications for ground ambulance, medical personnel, as needed
- ☐ Ensure proper security and traffic control.

TRIAGE UNIT LEADER (This position will be filled, only if needed)


- □ Locate and TRIAGE all patients and relays information to Medical Group Supervisor.
- Ensure that Airway, Breathing and Circulation stabilization of patients is addressed during TRIAGE.
- Coordinate with Treatment Unit Leader for patient stabilization, extrication, and movement to treatment area.
- □ Utilize the "START" TRIAGE system.

TREATMENT UNIT LEADER (This position will be filled, only if needed)

- ☐ Establishes Immediate, Delayed and Minor treatment areas.
- □ Direct treatment and stabilization of Patients.
- □ Prioritize Patients for transport.
- ☐ Request medical personnel and supplies, as needed.
- ☐ Ensure continual TRIAGE of patients in treatment area.
- □ Coordinate with TRIAGE Unit leader for delivery of patients to the treatment area.
- □ Coordinate with the Transportation Unit Leader for delivery of patients to ambulances.
- ☐ Ensure documentation of patient conditions and treatments on TRIAGE tags.

TRANSPORTATION UNIT LEADER (This position will be filled, only if needed)

- Coordinate all patient transportation to medical facilities, air and ground.
- Establish communication with hospitals receiving patients.
- □ Coordinate with Treatment Unit Leader to determine number and category of patients.
- □ Designate ambulance/helicopter loading areas.
- □ Determine mode (air/ground) of patient transportation.
- ☐ Ensure patients information and destination is recorded.
