Ensure firefighter and public safety through adherence to all safety standards, maintaining situational awareness and appropriate implementation of evacuations, closures, and temporary flight restrictions. 2. Protect / minimize threats / loss to private investments; key cultural features as listed in the Delegation of Authority; and protect the integrity of the Okefenokee Wilderness. 3. Manage the fires within the swamp under a containment strategy in accordance with suppression actions outlined in the WFSA. In the East Zone, contain the fire west of the Swamp Perimeter Road in Charlton County; South and west of Hwy. 1 and the CSX Railroad line; and within the Swamp Road. 4. Provide accurate and timely information to agencies, stakeholders, and the public through public meetings, news releases, website updates, reports, meetings and personal contacts. 5. Manage the East Zone cost effectively and in an efficient manner to contain the fire within the acres and cost prescribed by the WFSA. 6. Manage any ongoing and future road and fireline rehab work. Begin documenting upland habitats that require restoration work, and provide the Refuge, National Forest, and the State Forest(s) with a working Emergency Stabilization and Rehabilitation Plan as required by each agency as needed.

WEATHER DISCUSSION:

High pressure over the Gulf of Mexico will keep breezy west to southwest winds in place across the complex through Tuesday. In addition, there is a chance for mainly afternoon and evening showers and thunderstorms both days as a series of upper level disturbances cross the area.

WEATHER FORECAST MONDAY:

WEATHER: Partly cloudy and breezy. Scattered showers and thunderstorms in the afternoon. Chance of rain 40 percent. Patchy smoke.

MAX TEMPERATURES: Around 90. (24 hour trend = up 2 degrees)

MIN HUMIDITY: 37 to 42 percent (24 hour trend = down 2 percent)

20 FT WINDS: West 7 to 12 mph with gusts to 18 mph, becoming southwest 11 to 16 mph with gusts to 30 mph in the afternoon.

STABILITY/INVERSION: Mixing heights around 8000 ft.

Dispersion Index 68. Haines Index 4.

TRANSPORT WINDS: Southwest 27 mph.

WEATHER FORECAST MONDAY NIGHT:

WEATHER: Partly cloudy. Isolated showers and thunderstorms, mainly in the evening. Chance of rain 20 percent. Patchy smoke.

MIN TEMPERATURES: Low around 66.

MAX HUMIDITY: Recovery around 85 percent near hot spots and near 100 percent elsewhere.

20 FT WINDS: Southwest 9 to 14 mph with gusts to 25 mph through 2000, then decreasing to 6 to 10 mph.

<p>All Divisions: Warmer, drier, and still windy after a strong drying day yesterday. Both swamp and pineland fuels will display rapid, and similar, rates of spread if allowed the opportunity. However, our unlined swamp fuels still had some standing water interspersed yesterday and should hold in place today. Escapes into the upland pine should be the greater concern given yesterday's rapid drying on those sites. Fuel moisture sticks at Eddy Tower dropped from 26 to 8. Fire intensity and probability of ignition show only a moderate resistance to control, but it's likely to be higher than indicated with gusting winds and strong dispersion. ROS for heavy needle cast is modeled at 3-5 ch/hr with 2-3 foot flame lengths.</p> <p>Structure: Okefenokee administrative site should not be impacted by fire spread during this operational period....</p> <p>IA: Expect very active fire behavior once fires become established.</p>

The Division Supervisor will notify communications by radio or cell phone (Big Turnaround ICP 912-496-2111). Communications to notify MEDL @ 904-955-0022 / 602-702-2440 / 520-560-2742.</p> <p>The report should include type of illness/injury and exact location of the incident. Communications will clear the air for emergency traffic only and will request key personnel to report to communications. If an air medical helicopter is used within the fire perimeter, communications should notify the air operations director and helibase.</p> <p>After hours emergencies in Kingsland and/or Folkston: Call 911, then call communications @ 912-496-2111. Communications will call MEDL and designated paramedics will be routed to the scene to facilitate transportation needs.</p>

INCIDENT EMERGENCY PLAN (IEP)

The goal of this Incident Emergency Plan (IEP) is to provide the guidelines necessary to Locate, Triage, Extricate, Treat and Transport accident Patients. The Division/Group Supervisor will initially oversee the emergency. Radio communication will be on the "Command Frequency". Names of injured or deceased individuals should not be given over the radio. Deceased individuals and their equipment are not to be moved, except to accomplish rescue work or to protect the health and safety of others. It is expected this organization will come from resources assigned within the Division or nearest adjoining forces.

DIVISION/GROUP SUPERVISOR

- Conduct Size-up of the Incident (Nature of Accident, Number/Type of Resources, Location)
- Coordinate "Line EMT" response to the accident (Utilize Closest EMT's).
- Begin "TRIAGE"
- Determine and initiate treatment and transportation needs
- Evaluate special needs (Law Enforcement, Heavy Rescue, Haz Mat)
- Coordinate with Air Attack for Air-Medical transportation needs
- Preserve the scene for accident investigation

MEDICAL GROUP SUPERVISOR (This position will be filled, only if needed)

- Supervise TRIAGE, Treatment and Transportation Unit Leaders.
- Place orders through Communications for ground ambulance, medical personnel, as needed
- Ensure proper security and traffic control.

TRIAGE UNIT LEADER (This position will be filled, only if needed)

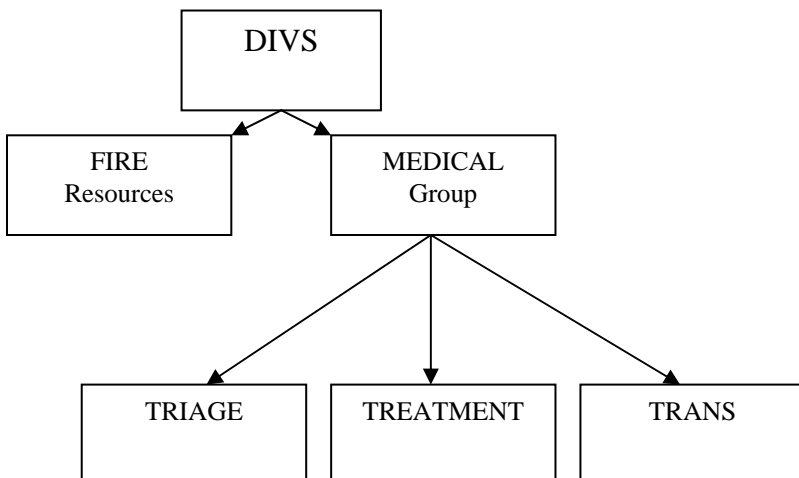
- Locate and TRIAGE all patients and relays information to Medical Group Supervisor.
- Ensure that Airway, Breathing and Circulation stabilization of patients is addressed during TRIAGE.
- Coordinate with Treatment Unit Leader for patient stabilization, extrication, and movement to treatment area.
- Utilize the "START" TRIAGE system.

TREATMENT UNIT LEADER (This position will be filled, only if needed)

- Establishes Immediate, Delayed and Minor treatment areas.
- Direct treatment and stabilization of Patients.
- Prioritize Patients for transport.
- Request medical personnel and supplies, as needed.
- Ensure continual TRIAGE of patients in treatment area.
- Coordinate with TRIAGE Unit leader for delivery of patients to the treatment area.
- Coordinate with the Transportation Unit Leader for delivery of patients to ambulances.
- Ensure documentation of patient conditions and treatments on TRIAGE tags.

TRANSPORTATION UNIT LEADER (This position will be filled, only if needed)

- Coordinate all patient transportation to medical facilities, air and ground.
- Establish communication with hospitals receiving patients.
- Coordinate with Treatment Unit Leader to determine number and category of patients.
- Designate ambulance/helicopter loading areas.
- Determine mode (air/ground) of patient transportation.
- Ensure patients information and destination is recorded.



- MINOR: Walking Wounded
- DELAYED: **CAN** Follow Simple Commands
- IMMEDIATE: Respirations have been restored
Respirations above 30
Radial Pulse Absent
Capillary Refill > 2 seconds
CAN NOT Follow Simple Command
- FATALITY: No Respirations after head tilt
