WEATHER DISCUSSION:

Numerous showers and thunderstorms are expected today as a series of upper level disturbances cross the area. High pressure will build over the region from the south on Wednesday, bringing with it warmer and drier weather.

WEATHER FORECAST TUESDAY:

WEATHER: Partly to mostly cloudy. Numerous showers and thunderstorms, mainly in the afternoon. Some thunderstorms could produce gusty and erratic winds, small hail and brief heavy rainfall. Chance of rain 60 percent.

MAX TEMPERATURES: Around 89. (24 hour trend = little change)

MIN HUMIDITY: 40 to 45 percent (24 hour trend = down 2 percent)

20 FT WINDS: West-southwest 6 to 10 mph with gusts to 15 mph, increasing to 8 to 12 mph with gusts to 22 mph in the afternoon.

STABILITY/INVERSION: Mixing heights around 6500 ft.

All Divisions: Yesterday's rain diminished potential fire behavior from predicted, and may do so again today. Without further rain, look for moderate to active behavior from fire with someplace to go... depending on previous rainfall amounts and wind speeds. Keep in mind that rainfall amounts have been variable; assess local conditions before engaging. Escapes into the upland pine should continue to be our greatest concern given the much faster drying potential for those fuels. Water retention in the swamp should limit the likelihood of fire spread in most locations. Fire intensity and probability of ignition show only a moderate resistance to control. ROS for heavy needle cast is modeled at 4 ch/hr with 2 foot flame lengths.

Structure: Okefenokee administrative site should not be impacted by fire spread during this operational period.

IA: Expect moderate to active fire behavior once fires become established.

AIR OPERATIONS:

Potential for rapid developing T-storms with possible lightning, hail, and strong downdrafts.

SAFETY:

30/30 Rule: Thunder heard w/in 30 seconds of observed lightning; take counter measures. Do not resume work in expose areas until 30 minutes after storm activity has passed. See "Thunderstorm Safety" in IRPG.

Predicted ERC for today is 37... 90th percentile is 35.

The goal of this Incident Emergency Plan (IEP) is to provide the guidelines necessary to Locate, Triage, Extricate, Treat and Transport accident Patients. The Division/Group Supervisor will initially oversee the emergency. Radio communication will be on the "Command Frequency". Names of injured or deceased individuals should not be given over the radio. Deceased individuals and their equipment are not to be moved, except to accomplish rescue work or to protect the health and safety of others. It is expected this organization will come from resources assigned within the Division or nearest adjoining forces.

DIVISION/GROUP SUPERVISOR

- Conduct Size-up of the Incident (Nature of Accident, Number/Type of Resources, Location)
- □ Coordinate "Line EMT" response to the accident (Utilize Closest EMT's).
- □ Begin "TRIAGE"
- Determine and initiate treatment and transportation needs
- □ Evaluate special needs (Law Enforcement, Heavy Rescue, Haz Mat)
- Coordinate with Air Attack for Air-Medical transportation needs
- □ Preserve the scene for accident investigation

MEDICAL GROUP SUPERVISOR (This position will be filled, only if needed)

- □ Supervise TRIAGE, Treatment and Transportation Unit Leaders.
- Delace orders through Communications for ground ambulance, medical personnel, as needed
- □ Ensure proper security and traffic control.

TRIAGE UNIT LEADER (This position will be filled, only if needed)


- □ Locate and TRIAGE all patients and relays information to Medical Group Supervisor.
- □ Ensure that Airway, Breathing and Circulation stabilization of patients is addressed during TRIAGE.
- Coordinate with Treatment Unit Leader for patient stabilization, extrication, and movement to treatment area.
- □ Utilize the "START" TRIAGE system.

TREATMENT UNIT LEADER (This position will be filled, only if needed)

- Establishes Immediate, Delayed and Minor treatment areas.
- Direct treatment and stabilization of Patients.
- □ Prioritize Patients for transport.
- □ Request medical personnel and supplies, as needed.
- Ensure continual TRIAGE of patients in treatment area.
- Coordinate with TRIAGE Unit leader for delivery of patients to the treatment area.
- Coordinate with the Transportation Unit Leader for delivery of patients to ambulances.
- Ensure documentation of patient conditions and treatments on TRIAGE tags.

TRANSPORTATION UNIT LEADER (This position will be filled, only if needed)

- Coordinate all patient transportation to medical facilities, air and ground.
- Establish communication with hospitals receiving patients.
- □ Coordinate with Treatment Unit Leader to determine number and category of patients.
- Designate ambulance/helicopter loading areas.
- Determine mode (air/ground) of patient transportation.
- Ensure patients information and destination is recorded.



FINANCE NOTES

If you can not and do not take a lunch or dinner break, you <u>must</u> document the reason in the remarks section of the crew time report.

****** Examples: No dinner meal break taken because; no meal available; unable to leave post; break taken at end of shift.
