5. GENERAL CONTROL OBJECTIVES FOR THE INCIDENT (INCLUDE ALTERNATIVES)

- 1. Ensure firefighter and public safety through adherence to all safety standards, maintaining situational awareness and appropriate implementation of evacuations, closures, and temporary flight restrictions.
- 2. Protect / minimize threats / loss to private investments; key cultural features as listed in the Delegation of Authority; and protect the integrity of the Okefenokee Wilderness.
- 3. Manage the fires within the swamp under a containment strategy in accordance with suppression actions outlined in the WFSA. Contain the fire within the Swamp Perimeter Road; South and west of Hwy. 1 and the CSX Railroad line; and east of the Swamp Road.
- 4. Provide accurate and timely information to agencies, stakeholders, and the public through public meetings, news releases, website updates, reports, meetings and personal contacts.
- 5. Manage the incident cost effectively and in an efficient manner to contain the fire within the acres and cost prescribed by the WFSA.
- 6. Manage any ongoing and future road and fireline rehab work. Document upland habitats that require restoration work, and provide that documentation to the ESR-BAER **Group Team Leader promptly.**

#### **WEATHER DISCUSSION:**

High pressure extending across the region from the western Atlantic Ocean will keep generally light winds in place through Saturday. Isolated showers and thunderstorms may affect the complex Friday afternoon and early evening, mainly along and ahead of the sea breeze boundary.

### **WEATHER FORECAST FRIDAY:**

**WEATHER:** Mostly sunny, becoming partly cloudy around midday as cumulus develop. Isolated showers and thunderstorms possible, mainly after 1500. Chance of rain 20 percent.

MAX TEMPERATURES: Around 96. (24 hour trend = up 1 degree)
MIN HUMIDITY: 35 to 40 percent (24 hour trend = down 3 percent)

**20 FT WINDS:** Light west-southwest, becoming south 2 to 6 mph in the afternoon, then shifting southeast 4 to 8 mph with gusts to 13 mph after 1730. Note: Winds could be variable at times throughout the day.

**STABILITY/INVERSION:** Mixing heights around 8000 ft.

Dispersion Index 40. Haines Index 4. TRANSPORT WINDS: Southwest 7 mph.

#### **WEATHER FORECAST FRIDAY NIGHT:**

**WEATHER:** Partly cloudy with isolated showers and thunderstorms through 2000, then becoming mostly clear. Chance of rain 20 percent.

**20 FT WINDS:** South-southeast 2 to 6 mph through 2000, then becoming light and variable.

#### **WEATHER SUMMARY:**

Hot... Isolated showers and thunderstorms in the afternoon. Chance of rain 20%. Minimum humidity 35-40%. Winds swinging from WSW, through South, to SE (after 1730)... 2-6 mph early afternoon, 4-8 late with gusts to 13. See attached Fire Weather Forecast.

#### SPECIFIC FIRE BEHAVIOR:

All Divisions: Slightly drier fuels will fail to increase fire behavior from yesterday's predicted until coupled with the (also slightly) higher wind speeds in late afternoon. For most of the afternoon upland pine fuels will display moderate behavior with rates of spread near 8-10 ch/hr and 3 to 4-foot flame lengths. Following a period of somewhat higher wind late, potential behavior will drop rapidly after dark until reaching the numbers above near midnight. Continued drying under warm temperatures may slowly increase smoking in the smoldering ground fire tomorrow, but we should still be a few days away from any flaming in those surface fuels. Each dry day should continue to help expose any heat that remains buried in berms or elsewhere. At the same time, they will also set the stage for increasing behavior if significant winds develop. For now, needle-cast rate of spread is modeled at 2-ch/hr with 1-foot flame lengths.

**Structure:** Okefenokee administrative site should not be impacted by fire spread during this operational period.

**IA:** Expect moderate fire behavior once fires become established.

#### **AIR OPERATIONS:**

No restrictions after 0900.

#### SAFETY:

Our moderate fire-behavior potential is largely dependent on lack of wind. Fuels are starting to dry enough that small increases near storm cells will make a large difference.

Predicted ERC for today is 42... 90<sup>th</sup> percentile is 35.

## **Rehab Specifications**

#### **Dozer Lines**

**General Description:** Rehabilitation of suppression constructed "Dozer Lines" and "Berms" is necessary to avoid excessive soil erosion and restore natural landscape surface water flow.

**Location** (**Suitable**) **Sites:** See incident map for location of known dozer lines and berms. Berms with merchantable timber have been identified on incident maps. Additional lines should be rehabilitated as they are discovered in the field. All discoveries will be turned into situation unit and subsequently mapped.

**Berm Definition:** Berms with merchantable timber embedded within that is mixed with soil and smaller debris.

Merchantable Timber Definition: Minimum 2" top and 20 foot length.

## **Design/Construction Specifications**

For areas with Merchantable Timber: Use excavator with thumb to remove the merchantable timber from the berm. Scatter the debris and soil into the fireline area. Lay out logs with the butt end towards the road. Leave the road open and in good shape. Merchantable timber will be removed at a later date. Ditches should be pulled and the road graded after the timber has been salvaged.

**For areas with Non-merchantable Timber:** Use heavy equipment to scatter debris and soil into the fireline area. Leave the road open and in good shape. Ditches should be pulled and the road graded after the timber has been salvaged.

- \* **Burnout Operations:** A burnout operation is in the plan for today to tie up the west side. If you are called on to string some fire, be aware of the dangers that will be present. Be sure of your footing as you move along the line. Watch out for snags and avoid them if at all possible. Where this is not possible, mitigate the situation by the use of LCES. Keep your mind on the job at hand.
- \* Driving Distances: As we head back to the west side, driving times are on the increase once again. Don't let yourself become distracted. Keep your mind on the job at hand. If another driver is in the vehicle with you, swap out if you get tired. Remember: Drive within posted speed limits, wear your seatbelts, drive with lights on, and DRIVE DEFENSIVELY!

The Division Supervisor will notify communications by radio or cell phone (Big Turnaround ICP 912-496-2111). Communications to notify MEDL @ 904-955-0022 /912-218-9101.

The report should include type of illness/injury and exact loaction of the incident. Communications will clear the air for emergency traffic only and will request key personnel to report to communications. If an air medical helicopter is used within the fire perimeter, communications should notify the air operations director and helibase.

After hours emergencies in Kingsland and/or Folkston: Call 911, then call communications @ 912-496-2111. Communications will call MEDL and designated paramedics will be routed to the scene to facilitate transportation needs.

#### INCIDENT EMERGENCY PLAN (IEP)

The goal of this Incident Emergency Plan (IEP) is to provide the guidelines necessary to Locate, Triage, Extricate, Treat and Transport accident Patients. The Division/Group Supervisor will initially oversee the emergency. Radio communication will be on the "Command Frequency". Names of injured or deceased individuals should not be given over the radio. Deceased individuals and their equipment are not to be moved, except to accomplish rescue work or to protect the health and safety of others. It is expected this organization will come from resources assigned within the Division or nearest adjoining forces.

#### DIVISION/GROUP SUPERVISOR

- Conduct Size-up of the Incident (Nature of Accident, Number/Type of Resources, Location)
- □ Coordinate "Line EMT" response to the accident (Utilize Closest EMT's).
- □ Begin "TRIAGE"
- □ Determine and initiate treatment and transportation needs
- ☐ Evaluate special needs (Law Enforcement, Heavy Rescue, Haz Mat)
- ☐ Coordinate with Air Attack for Air-Medical transportation needs
- □ Preserve the scene for accident investigation

### MEDICAL GROUP SUPERVISOR (This position will be filled, only if needed)

- ☐ Supervise TRIAGE, Treatment and Transportation Unit Leaders.
- Place orders through Communications for ground ambulance, medical personnel, as needed
- ☐ Ensure proper security and traffic control.

#### TRIAGE UNIT LEADER (This position will be filled, only if needed)


- □ Locate and TRIAGE all patients and relays information to Medical Group Supervisor.
- Ensure that Airway, Breathing and Circulation stabilization of patients is addressed during TRIAGE.
- Coordinate with Treatment Unit Leader for patient stabilization, extrication, and movement to treatment area.
- □ Utilize the "START" TRIAGE system.

#### TREATMENT UNIT LEADER (This position will be filled, only if needed)

- ☐ Establishes Immediate, Delayed and Minor treatment areas.
- □ Direct treatment and stabilization of Patients.
- □ Prioritize Patients for transport.
- ☐ Request medical personnel and supplies, as needed.
- ☐ Ensure continual TRIAGE of patients in treatment area.
- Coordinate with TRIAGE Unit leader for delivery of patients to the treatment area.
- □ Coordinate with the Transportation Unit Leader for delivery of patients to ambulances.
- ☐ Ensure documentation of patient conditions and treatments on TRIAGE tags.

#### TRANSPORTATION UNIT LEADER (This position will be filled, only if needed)

- Coordinate all patient transportation to medical facilities, air and ground.
- ☐ Establish communication with hospitals receiving patients.
- □ Coordinate with Treatment Unit Leader to determine number and category of patients.
- □ Designate ambulance/helicopter loading areas.
- □ Determine mode (air/ground) of patient transportation.
- ☐ Ensure patients information and destination is recorded.
