

WEATHER DISCUSSION:

Deep layer moisture starts to build ahead of a surface front that resides north of the area. This frontal system stalls during the week and in combination with upper level southwest flow, showers and possibly strong thunderstorms tending to rain areas develop Tuesday and will continue through to the midweek.

WEATHER FORECAST TUESDAY AND TUEDAY NIGHT:

WEATHER: Becoming mostly cloudy. Scattered showers and thunderstorms developing during the afternoon and evening. Chance of rain 50 percent in day, 30 percent at night.
TEMPERATURES: MAX 87 to 92. (24 hour trend = down 3 degrees) MIN around 72.
HUMIDITY: MIN around 40 percent (24 hour trend = up 10-15 percent) MAX near 100 percent.
20 FT WINDS: DAY Light and variable winds in the morning then becoming south to southwest and increasing to 5 to 10 mph with gusts to 15 mph in the afternoon. NIGHT Light southwest
STABILITY/INVERSION: DAY Morning smoke and fog lifting around 0900 then smoke drifting north. Increasing instability through day. Mixing heights around 6000 ft. Dispersion Index 38. NIGHT Inversion to 500 feet with localized visibilities reduced to a mile or less in fog/smoke after 0200. Dispersion Index 3. TRANSPORT WINDS: DAY Southwest 12-14 mph. LAL 3.

WEATHER FORECAST WEDNESDAY AND WEDNESDAY NIGHT:

WEATHER: Cloudy with showers and thunderstorms likely, some storms may be strong to severe. Chance of rain 70 percent in day, 40 percent at night.

TEMPERATURES: MAX 85 to 90. (24 hour trend = down 2 degrees) MIN around 73.

HUMIDITY: MIN around 50 %.(24 hour trend = up 10 percent) MAX near 100 percent.

20 FT WINDS: DAY Light southwest winds increasing to 5 to 10 mph with gusts to 15 mph later in the morning. **NIGHT** Light southwest

STABILITY/INVERŠION: DAY Mixing heights increasing to around 4500 ft. Dispersion Index 25. **NIGHT** Inversion to 500 feet with localized visibilities reduced to a mile or less in fog/smoke after 0200. Dispersion Index 3.

TRANSPORT WINDS: DAY Southwest 14-16 mph. LAL 4.

SPECIFIC FIRE BEHAVIOR:

All Divisions: The predicted rates of spread and flame lengths above are based on an established fire on higher ground with max wind speeds in the warmest and driest period of the day, prior to any precipitation on Tuesday and outside the current fire perimeter. The most active remaining portion of the fire will be in bay fuels, which will continue smoldering in duff and roots over muck soils. After moisture is received, expect only smoldering and creeping fire behavior in Divisions WE and WF. Reburn risk on Tuesday & Wednesday should be minimal, due to high humidity.

Structure: Okefenokee administrative site should not be impacted by fire spread during this operational period.

IA: Expect moderate fire behavior on Tuesday and minimal fire behavior on Wednesday with any new starts outside of the main fire. Thunderstorm downdrafts may accelerate any established fire. Lightning activity today and tomorrow may ignite new fires.

AIR OPERATIONS:

No restrictions after 0900.

SAFETY:

Maintain situational awareness around snags, especially when wind speeds increase. Practice the 30/30 rule around thunderstorms to prevent exposure to lightning (see pg. 75 of the IRPG)

Predicted ERC for today is 32 and below 30 for Wednesday... 90th percentile is 35.

<u>Severe Weather</u> – potential for lightning, high winds, rain, and possibly hail. In your IRPG review Hazard Tree Safety, pg. 80 and Thunderstorm Safety, pg. 74.

Driving – if we get the predicted rains the roads will become impassable in areas. When the rain starts falling have a plan. Seeing more and more public out on the Perimeter Road checking things out, continue looking out for the other driver.

<u>Communications</u> – implement recommendations from Com Unit to resolve Commo problems on Westside of the Incident. I dentify deadspots, provide feedback to the Comm Unit.

Initial Attack – remember our IA responsibilities. Ensure LCES is in place before beginning operational tactics.

Entrapment Avoidance

Scenario

Six Minutes Home > NIFC Home

You are a crew member on a crew on a wildfire building line along the flank of a fire. Suddenly, your crew boss directs the crew to use the escape route and move to the designated Safety Zone. Upon arrival at the Safety Zone the crew boss directs the crew to begin to prepare to deploy their shelters.

What Are The Critical Issues

Avoiding situations where firefighters become entrapped is the first concern when devising strategy and tactics. The following discussion points are among the things that should be considered.

Critical Safety Measures

Review how LCES relates to the 10 Standard Fire Orders.

Discuss safety zone, entrapment, and deployment area.

- Safety zone a preplanned area of sufficient size and suitable location that is expected to prevent injury to fire to firefighters from known hazards without using fire shelters
- Entrapment when a firefighter is trapped between the oncoming fire and a safety zone, causing burnover with or without a fire shelter deployment
- Deployment area a selected topographical site that must be used when retreat to a safety zone is cut off by fire, has little or no fuel to cause flame impingement on the fire shelter, which will disintegrate it

Discuss escape routes.

- Escape route the travel route or path that provides the safety margin allowing the firefighter a retreat to the safety zone before the flame front overtakes the firefighter
- Have multiple escape routes in case of cut off
- Scout and personally observe hazards (e.g., cliffs, loose soils, rocks, vegetation, steep slopes, etc.).
- Precut escape lanes to safety zones.
- Use predicted fire behavior to assess impact on escape routes.
- Time your escape routes before needing to actually use them. Account for slowest firefighters and or equipment. Know your escape time.
- Clearly mark escapes routes.
- Do not locate escape routes near chimneys, saddles, narrow canyons or box canyons.
