<u>Saturday</u> The combination of warmer afternoon temperatures and slightly drier conditions will lead to lower relative humidity values during the weekend. High temperature will be 96 degrees and relative humidity will reach a low of 35%. Afternoon winds southeast 6 to 8 miles per hour.

SPECIFIC FIRE BEHAVIOR:

All Divisions: The predicted rates of spread and flame lengths above are based on an established fire on higher ground with max wind speeds in the warmest and driest period of the day outside the current fire perimeter. The most active remaining portion of the fire will be in bay fuels, which will continue smoldering in stump holes, duff and roots. Smoldering and creeping fire behavior will continue in Divisions WE and WF, as fuels dry from the recent precipitation. Reburn risk on Saturday is moderate with lower humidity and higher temperatures.

Structure: Okefenokee administrative site should not be impacted by fire spread during this operational period.

IA: Expect moderate fire behavior today on any new starts outside of the main fire perimeter, especially when in the presence wind. Also, watch for reburn in recently dropped pine litter, particularly on the drier north end of the fire.

AIR OPERATIONS:

No restrictions after 0900.

SAFETY:

Maintain situational awareness around snags, especially when wind speeds increase. Practice the 30/30 rule around thunderstorms to prevent exposure to lightning (see pg. 75 of the IRPG)

Predicted ERC for Saturday is 32 and 33 ... 90th percentile is 35.

<u>**Driving</u>** - drive with headlights on at all times, obey speed limits. Log hauling is occurring in various locations within the Complex area.</u>

<u>Hydration</u> – warmer weather, increase your fluid intake. Rule of thumb, two bottles of water for every bottle of Sports drink. Continue to keep eating.

<u>Hazard Trees</u>- don't look just for the snags. Green trees can kill you also. Lots of "hang-ups" out there.

Situational Awareness

- I dentify trigger points for disengagement and re-engagement
- Re-evaluate, change your plan as needed
- Evaluate risk vs. gain
- LCES is in place before engaging in any assignment
- Be alert to wind shifts

Scenarios: Scenario 1

Six Minutes Home Page

INITIAL ATTACK FIRE SIZEUP/SAFETY

Having a good sizeup is important in order to give both the Incident Commander (IC) and fire management a good idea of what problems exist and what resources may be needed for effective firefighting.

- Use the following reporting factors for sizeup. Discuss others that may be used.
 - Fire name and location
 - Terrain (slope, aspect, elevation) and position of fire on the slope
 - Size of fire
 - Fuel type, anticipated control problems, and spread potential
 - Values threatened
 - Weather conditions (wind speed and direction)
 - Fire behavior
 - Resources on the fire and those needed
 - Estimated containment and control times
 - Cause (known, suspected, under investigation)

After your initial sizeup of the fire and/or transition from an initial attack IC, answer the following questions. Repeat this analysis whenever there is a change, or predicted change, in conditions on the fire.

- Have you sized up the fire and relayed the information to dispatch?
- Is the observed fire weather consistent with the forecast?
- Can you control the fire with the resources available (on the incident or soon to be on the incident) and under the expected conditions?
- Have you developed a plan to attack the fire (direct or indirect, anchor points, escape routes, head or flank attack, priority areas); and have you communicated this information to all personnel assigned to the incident, including new arrivals?
- Are lookouts in place or can you see all of the fire area?
- Can you communicate with everyone on the fire and with dispatch?
- Are escape routes and safety zones established? If you are using the black, is it completely burned and without a reburn potential?
- Are safety and the standard fire orders being followed?
- Do you have a complete list of what resources have been ordered for the fire?
- Will you control the fire before the next operational period; and if you won't, or the size of the organization exceeds the IC's capability to manage, have you informed the agency Fire Management Officer?
