

### Weather Summary:

Yesterdays scattered thunderstorm development generated shower activity. Some fire areas received trace amounts while other areas like Manor & Homerville received as much as ½ inch to 7/10ths of an inch of rain. The rainfall also generated higher RHs. The combined positive impact inhibited new fire starts and re-burn potential.

#### **General Fire Behavior:**

Yesterday's fire behavior was limited to the organic soils or hot spots along the firelines. This activity was centered on Divisions WI, WH, WG, & WW. The Gum Maple Bay Swamp fuel type in these Divisions contains areas that will support ground fire. Follow-up in-stand examinations of this fuel type revealed that the surface litter and duff layer are too moist to support future burn out operations even though there is active ground fire.

Surrounding Pine Plantations (4 to 7 ft tall pine saplings with grass & low shrubs or Sawtimber sized plantations with southern shrub evergreen species 4 to 6 ft. tall) were tested and can support surface fires within 1 day following a significant rainfall event. Yesterday's additional rains that were received from thunderstorm activity further dampened & eventually removed these fuels from being capable to ignite. Remember with just one day of excellent drying fuels will be available to burn. Favorable wind directions will exist today: SW – AM & then WSW – PM. These wind directions reduce the possibility of fire escapes from "hot" Divisions. The Probability of Ignition is 20%. The following Fire Behavior is being provided to assist in time distance operational planning.

These will be very difficult to ignite since they will retain the beneficial influence of the rain from Friday's rain event as well as the showers from yesterday afternoon.

Pine & Cypress Pine Plantation w/ low & sparse southern rough\* same as above

\*note when the southern rough is > 4 ft tall these plantations can easily support crown fire runs.

### Air Operations:

There are no restrictions on air operations as the skies will be clear. There will be the development of cumulus clouds. Smoke production is expected to be very minimal. Aircraft should be advised that there will be less erratic winds, but thunderstorms development is possible after in the afternoon.

### Safety:

Areas of deep duff or organic burning have tree root systems that are weakened. These trees will be a hazard even without the influence of wind. Wind gusts associated with the thunderstorms are predicted to be > 30 mph. Stay alert to this serious safety hazard.

Tropical Storm Barry brought us significant rainfall amounts Saturday. Partly cloudy hot weather with moderate winds and moderate relative humidities will bring gradual drying. There is a chance of scattered showers and thunderstorms. Refer to page 75 in your Incident Response Pocket Guide for lightning mitigation. Plan and act accordingly. Maintain LCES at all times!

In the mop-up process, wear your PPE. Wear eye protection as needed, as eye injuries are common.

Snags are present, so be alert to any in your assignment area. Trees growing in peat soils can have weakened and burnt roots due to under ground burning that will allow them to fall without warning. Park vehicles a safe distance away from trees. Roads can be blocked quickly by falling trees and snags. If you are working around pumps, post a lookout for these snags. Following the storm, trees may have fallen across the roads. Predicted winds will increase the likelihood of snags falling. Maintain safe driving speeds and distances.

While driving, soft road shoulders and sloppy off road conditions could be a problem. Watch your footing on equipment and slippery ground surfaces.

Following the recent rains, snakes and alligators are out in force. Remain aware of your surroundings and maintain a safe distance from the local wildlife.


### Human Resource Message

Crews and/or other resources that must travel long distances to home units should file a route plan (RON) with Demob and check-in with their home unit dispatch.






