5. General Control Objectives For The Incident (Include Alternatives)

1. Provide for the safety of the public and assigned incident resources through effective hazard / risk assessment and mitigation.
2. Provide timely and accurate information updates to the GFC, cooperators, affected communities, and other stakeholders.
3. Provide accurate cost accountability and documentation of expenditures for the duration of the incident.
4. Develop and maintain coordination with local fire departments, local EOC directors, GEMA, other IMT's deployed in the area, GOAL, and private industry.
5. Provide support on fires as requested by Georgia GFC District 8 and District 10.
6. Conduct all incident activities in a manner free of discrimination, harassment, and inappropriate behavior.
7. Keep the Sweat Farm Road, Kneeknocker, and Roundabout fires contained within the current established perimeters.
8. Assist with identifying and mitigating Emergency & Temporary Repairs.

6. Weather Forecast For Period

WEATHER: Sunny, followed by a few cumulus developing around 1100. An isolated shower or thunderstorm is possible mainly after 1500. Chance of measurable rain 20%.

MAX TEMPERATURES: 94-98 (24 hour trend: unchanged)

MIN HUMIDITY: 33 to 38% (24 hour trend: unchanged)

20 FT WINDS: West winds 3-5 mph through 1000, then Northwest 5-10 mph. Around 1700, becoming southeast 4-8 mph with gusts up to 15 mph as the sea-breeze passes, especially eastern divisions.

STABILITY/INVERSION: Mixing heights near 7500 ft. Afternoon Dispersion index 43. Haines Index 4 (low).

Transport winds SW 7 mph through 1000, the becoming NW 8-10 mph, followed by SE where sea-breeze passes. Inversion near 800 feet early, lifting and the dissipating around 1000.

WEATHER DISCUSSION: An upper level ridge will remain over the area into the weekend, but will weaken. A weak cold front will approach the area on Sunday and stall. However, only isolated to scattered showers and thunderstorms are anticipated, mainly along the seabreeze. Most areas may not experience rainfall.

The **main concerns** are:

1. Warm temperatures and heat indices around 100.
2. Afternoon Sea Breeze passage possible with gusty winds and isolated showers and thunderstorms

WEATHER FORECAST DAY SHIFT SATURDAY: (See table for specific incident forecasts)

WEATHER: Sunny, followed by a few cumulus developing around 1100. An isolated shower or thunderstorm is possible mainly after 1500. Chance of measurable rain 20%.

MAX TEMPERATURES: 94-98 (24 hour trend: unchanged)

MIN HUMIDITY: 33 to 38% (24 hour trend: unchanged)

WEATHER: An isolated shower or thunderstorm before 2200, otherwise mostly clear. Patchy fog and smoke after 0200. Chance of measurable rain 20% early.

Min RH 33 to 38 %. Mixing height 8000 feet, dispersion index 50, transport winds Northwest 6-9 mph.

FIRE BEHAVIOR **June 9, 2007** **Vicky Edge, FBAN**

****Today's fire behavior is expected to be moderate in all areas. ****

Fire activity is mostly expected in Divisions WE, WF, WG, WI, WH, & WW where burnout operations took place yesterday. Pockets of unburned fuels will continue to require attention along with the possibility of reburn areas. Direct attack with Dozer/Tractor Plows should be effective today.

West 3-5 mph through 1000, then Northwest 5-10 mph / becoming southeast 4-8 mph with gusts up to 15 mph as the sea-breeze passes @1700, especially eastern divisions.

RH – 32% to 35% / Temp - 94 to 98

Rates of Spread –13 to 34 ft/min / Flame lengths – 4' to 12'

Probability of Ignition: 60% / KBDI: 333

Mixing heights today will push 7500'

SAFTEY: Monitoring and hot spotting the areas associated with yesterday's burnout will be necessary until these areas receive significant moisture is received. No foreseen problems with air ops for today.

Watch Out for **Snags!!!**. Snags in the area continue to fall. Don't work or park vehicles and equipment within falling distance of identified widow makers.

Close the Loops, if you are relieving resources that are timing out or moving into a new division, **be sure to ask questions**. If you are briefing others, **be clear**, use written instructions when possible and **ask for feedback**. Nothing should ever be left for someone to figure out. Provide contact information for follow ups.

Always **obey local traffic laws!** Proper following distance for engines, buses and other large vehicles is **"four seconds plus"** and **"three seconds plus"** for pickups and cars. Always leave room for other vehicles to pass when parking on fire line.

Give driving your full attention! Watch out for damaged or washed out section of road when traveling within the fire area. **DON'T STAND OR PARK IN THE ROAD!** Ensure daily maintenance checks are performed on all equipment and service as needed.

Keep in mind that use of Southern Linc phones can limit awareness to all in the taskforce. **Watch Outs, changes in weather or fire behavior should be discussed on handheld radios** to ensure it helps build to everyone's situational awareness.

Lessons Learned

Human factors are the major contributing factor to wildland fire motor vehicle accidents. **Human factors can include fatigue, level of operator proficiency and experience in the vehicle type, and unsafe operator practices.**

On wildland fire serious and fatal accidents, **fatigue** has been identified as a significant factor especially when operators have pushed to *cover long response distances or are otherwise working extended shifts*. Furthermore, it is during these periods when operators are likely to be driving in country that is unfamiliar to them. Generally, the cited accidents occurred while the operators were enroute to or returning from an incident, or driving on unfamiliar roads while at the incident location.

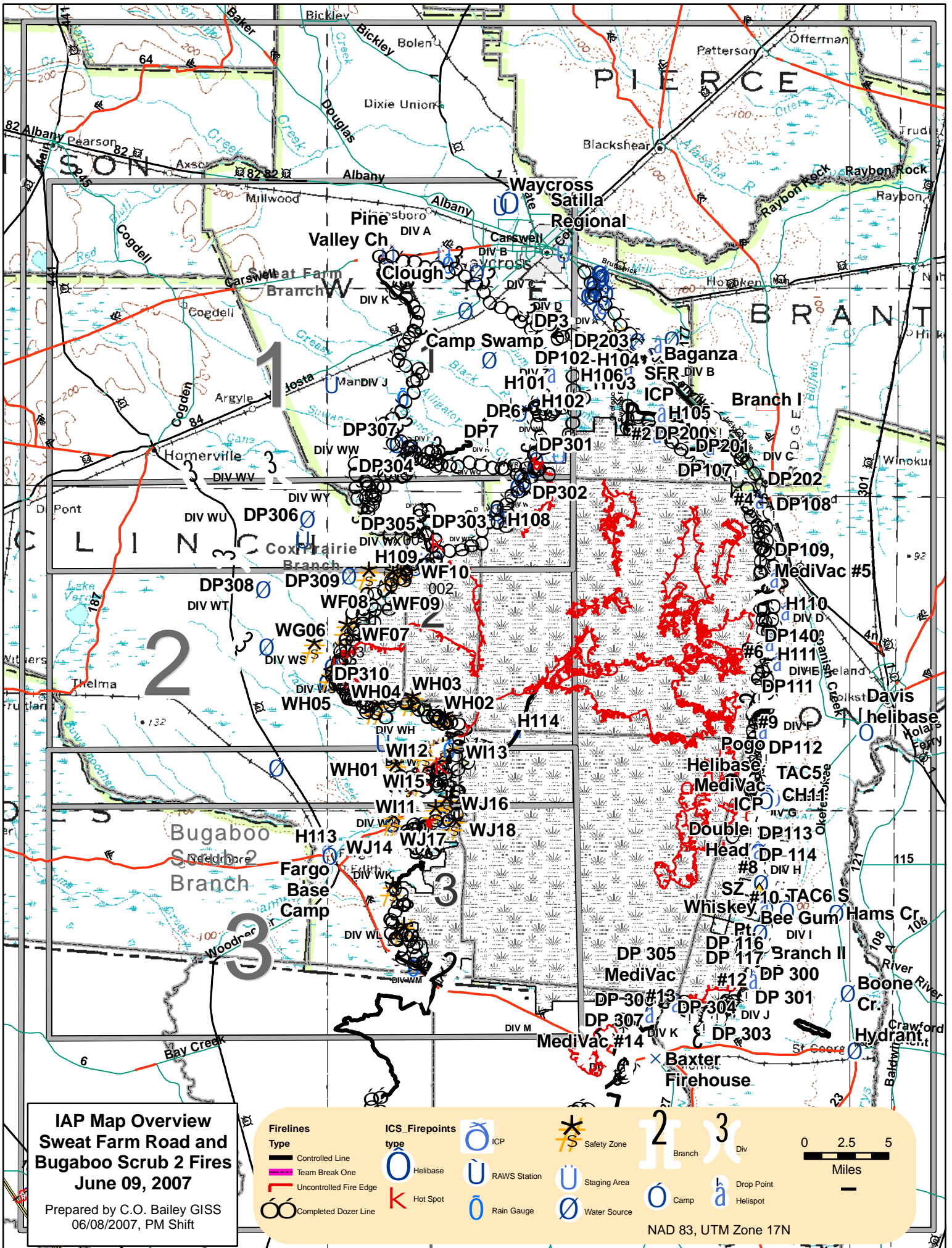

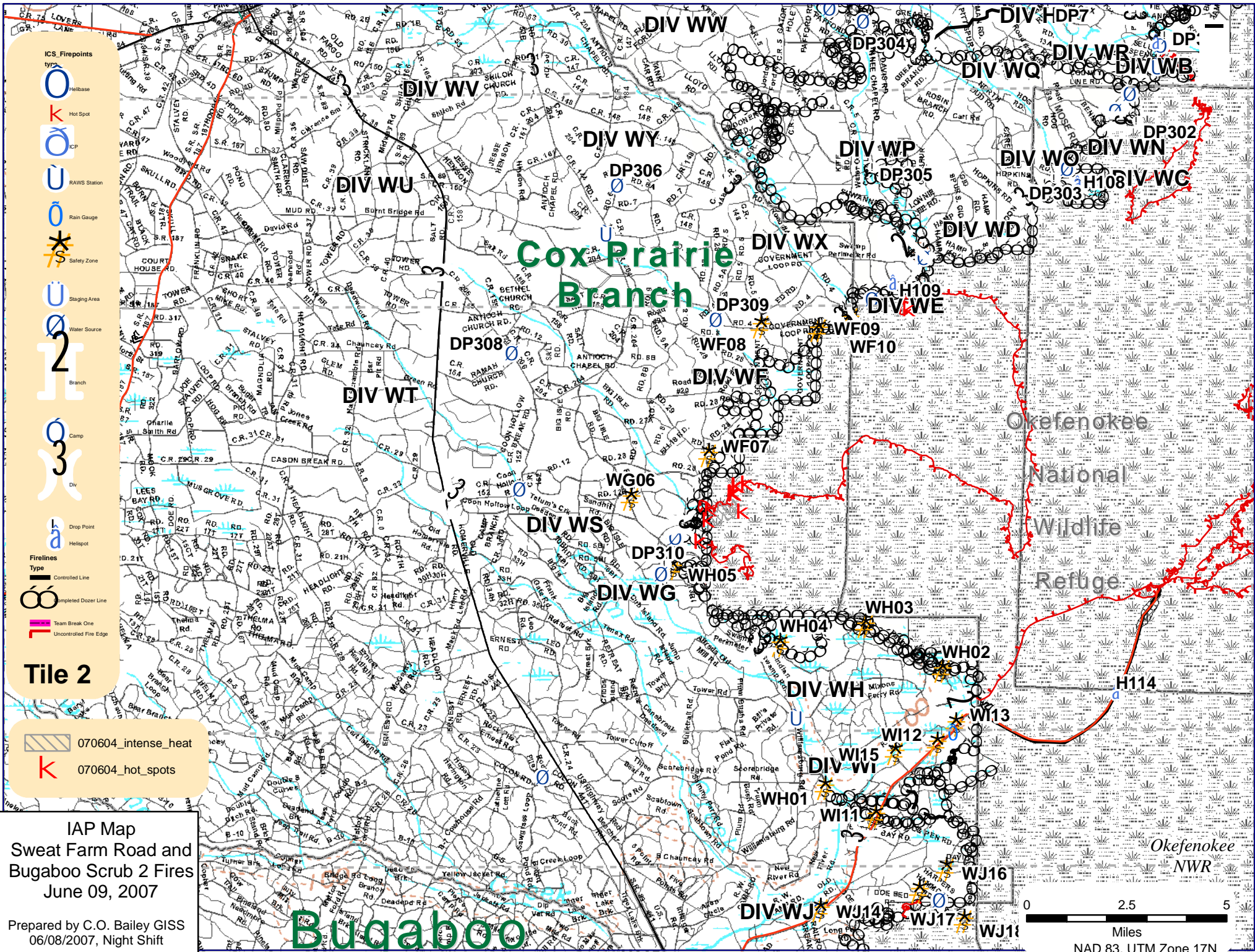
