<u>WEATHER DISCUSSION:</u> Upper level troughing will continue over the area one more day before shifting to the east on Saturday. High pressure will build in over the fire beginning on Saturday and continue through Monday. This will result in hotter, drier weather, with minimal chances for precipitation Sunday and

Monday. A cold front will approach the area beginning on Tuesday and this will result in increased chances of afternoon Showers and Thunderstorms.

WEATHER FORECAST DAY SHIFT FRIDAY

WEATHER: Partly Cloudy. Scattered afternoon showers and thunderstorms. Chance of measurable rain 30%.

MAX TEMPERATURES: 86-89 (24 hour trend: Up 1 to 2) MIN HUMIDITY: 33 to 38% (24 hour trend: Down 3 to 5)

20 FT WINDS: Northeast winds 3-8 through 1000, then East 5-10 mph, with gusts up to 15 mph. Becoming East-southeast 5 to 10 mph, with gusts up to 20 mph around 1600.

STABILITY/INVERSION: Mixing heights near 6500 ft. Afternoon Dispersion index 35. Haines Index 4 (Low). Transport winds ESE 9-13. Nocturnal inversion lifting and dissipating around 0900. **LAL:** 3

WEATHER FORECAST FOR FRIDAY NIGHT:

WEATHER: Partly cloudy becoming clear overnight. Chance of measurable rain 10% early.

MIN TEMPERATURES: 62-65 MAX HUMIDITY: 95-100% **20 FT WINDS**: East 2 to 4 mph.

STABILITY/INVERSION: A nocturnal low level inversion is expected around 500 feet, with localized visibilities of a mile or less in fog/smoke after 0100. Smoke drift W. Dispersion 3.

OUTLOOK FOR SATURDAY:

Partly cloudy. A 20 percent chance for mainly afternoon showers and thunderstorms. Highs 88-90. E winds 5 to 10 mph, becoming Southeast 5 to 10 mph, with gusts up to 15 mph. Min RH 30 to 35%. Mixing Height 6500 feet, dispersion index 30, transport winds NE 6-9 mph.

Sunday...Partly Cloudy. Lows 66 to 69. Highs 91 to 93. Min RH 28 to 33%. East-southeast Winds 5-10 G15 mph.

TODAY'S FIRE BEHAVIOR WILL BE LOW

Fire behavior will remain low with a Haines Index of 4. All divisions are showing less hot spots. New starts today will be slow to start and spread. Direct attack with Dozer/Tractor Plows will be effective today and with production constraints. Engines will be able to support in accessible areas.

NE 3- 8 mph through 1000, increasing with gusts E to 15mph. When Sea-breeze passes @1630 winds will become more E – SE gusty to 20mph.

RH - 33% to 38% / Temp - 86 - 89

Rates of Spread – Fuel Model 4 (heavy shrub) ROS - 20-30 ft/min / Flame lengths – 8' to 12' Fuel Model 7 (Southern Rough) ROS - 7 to 11 ft/min / Flame lengths – 5' to 12'

Probability of Ignition: 25% / KBDI: 403 Mixing heights today will push 6500'

SAFTEY: Utilize wetter conditions and higher fuel moisture periods to secure hot spots on the lines.

Major Hazards and Risks:

<u>Scan the road ahead</u> to spot hazards. Watch out for ATVs, heavy equipment and foot traffic in or near your path of travel. Get out of the vehicle and <u>look prior to backing</u> or use a spotter if someone is available.

With these temperatures continue to <u>drink plenty of water</u> to stay hydrated. **Monitor Command Channel for Weather Alerts**. Be sure the message is past on to all resources assigned. Cover <u>lightning safety</u> during tailgate briefing prior to starting work.

Look Up, Down and Around for snags, reburns, stump holes, hot pockets and other hazards. Be sure to **communicate** these hazards with all. Mitigate the ones you can and report the ones you can't to your Safety Officer.

If it lives here, it Bites! Snakes, ticks, alligators, bears, sand gnats and other critters are on the move so watch where you walk and check yourself for ticks daily. Do Not play with the wildlife!

Be aware of heavy traffic use by log trucks on both dirt & paved roads. Trucks require **higher** speeds on the sandier dirt roads to get through some spots and the best solution is to pull over & allow them to pass.

Symptoms & Signs of Heat Illness

<u>Heat Exhaustion:</u> Victim will have cool, clammy skin; pale coloring; feel weak, dizzy and/or nauseous.

Treatment – Have individual sit in shade or cool area; administer fluids; loosen clothing and assure rest.

Heat Stroke: This is a medical emergency!!

Victim will have hot, dry, red skin and possible convulsions. These symptoms can progress to unconsciousness and death!

Treatment – Immediately cool individual's body by pouring water over them, especially the head and upper body. Contact the medical unit. Monitor the victim and provide whatever medical support necessary. Placing ice around the neck, groin and armpits can help speed the cool down.

B. WHAT CAN YOU DO TO EXPEDITE THE PROCESS?


- 1. Turn in all time report and equipment use records to **Time.**
- 2. If you have equipment, have an inspection completed by **Ground Support.**
- 3. Turn in any non-essential items you have checked out to **Supply** or **Communications.**
- Complete and turn in Unit Logs on a daily basis to
 <u>Documentation</u> and get a Performance Evaluation from your supervisor (you keep original and a copy goes to the files)
- 5. If there is any change in your status, notify **<u>Demob</u>** immediately.
- 6. Check the Demob Board on a regular basis. Be available to move within a 1 to 2 hour notice.
