<u>WEATHER DISCUSSION:</u> Upper level troughing will begin to shift to the east today as strong high pressure builds in. This will result in a hot dry weekend, with minimal chances for precipitation. Moisture will begin to increase over the area on Monday with some isolated thunderstorms, but there will be a significant increase in moisture across the area on Tuesday. With the increase in moisture there will be better chances of wetting rains Tuesday and Wednesday.

Remember, fire behavior predictions are based on worse case scenario.

\*\*Continue to monitor the fire inside the Refuge as it continues to back into lines at Group/Division WE & WF. Activity picked up yesterday but was not threatening.

**IA:** Expect low to moderate to active fire behavior once fires become established. Should be well within the production rates and flame lengths constraints for dozers and engines.

### **Major Hazards and Risks:**

- ° Driving
- ° Weather

Use the <u>"What If"</u> strategy as you are scanning the road ahead. **Give driving your full attention** and do not let other passengers distract you from driving.

Weather is getting **HOTTER** and **DRIER** today and tomorrow! Expect more activity over the next two days. <u>Keep drinking plenty of water</u> throughout the day to prevent heat exhaustion.

**Look Up, Down and Around** for snags, reburns, stump holes, hot pockets and other hazards. Be sure to **communicate** these hazards with all. Mitigate the ones you can and report the ones you can't to your Safety Officer.

If it lives here, it Bites! Snakes, ticks, alligators, bears, sand gnats and other critters are on the move so watch where you walk and check yourself for ticks daily. Do Not play with the wildlife!

**Be aware** of heavy traffic use by log trucks on both dirt & paved roads. Trucks require **higher** speeds on the sandier dirt roads to get through some spots and the best solution is to pull over & allow them to pass.

#### RESPECT

#### Know your subordinates and look out for their well-being

- Put the safety of your subordinates above all other objectives.
- Take care of your subordinate's needs.
- Resolve conflicts between individuals on the team

#### Keep\_your subordinates informed

- Provide accurate and timely briefings.
- Give the reason (intent) for assignments and tasks.
- Make yourself available to answer questions at appropriate times.

#### Build the team

- Conduct frequent debriefings with the team to identify lessons learned.
- Recognize individual and team accomplishments and reward them appropriately.
- Apply disciplinary measures equally.

#### Employ your subordinates in accordance with their capabilities

- Observe human behavior as well as fire behavior.
- Provide early warning to subordinates of tasks they will be responsible for.
- Consider team experience, fatigue, and physical limitations when accepting assignments.

# B. WHAT CAN YOU DO TO EXPEDITE THE PROCESS?


- 1. Turn in all time report and equipment use records to **Time.**

   <u>Documentation</u> and get a Performance Evaluation from your supervisor (you keep original and a copy goes to the files)
- 5. If there is any change in your status, notify **<u>Demob</u>** immediately.
- 6. Check the Demob Board on a regular basis. Be available to move within a 1 to 2 hour notice.
