

<u>WEATHER DISCUSSION:</u> High pressure ridging will continue to prevail over the area today and this should continue into early Tuesday. Moisture will begin to increase over the area tomorrow and this will result in some isolated afternoon thunderstorms especially along the sea breeze. A more significant increase in moisture will occur on Wednesday out ahead of a cold front that will move into the area. The front will become stationary over south Georgia and this will become the focus of scattered Thunderstorms through Friday.

WEATHER: Partly Cloudy.

MAX TEMPERATURES: 95-98 (Steady)
MIN HUMIDITY: 28 to 33% (Steady)

WEATHER SUMMARY:

Hot dry conditions will continue to dry fuels today. Although 10 hr fuels are at 16% locally, highest since the fire began. Winds are out of the SE today 5- mph 10, possibly increasing as the Easterly sea breezes come in this afternoon.

SPECIFIC FIRE BEHAVIOR:

All Divisions: Hot dry weather will continue to dry the fuels today and fire behavior should be moderate. Smoldering fuels and duff will continue to burn and may see more visible flames in unburned fuels. Reburn flames are relatively low @<3'. Remember, fire behavior predictions are based on worse case scenario with the dries weather predictions and the highest winds.

**Continue to monitor the line that has unburned fuel between the break and the fire in the refuge at Group/Division WE & WF. Activity picked up, but was still not threatening the lines. The hardwood fuel there are not carrying well, but the fire will carry through the heavy downed timber on the ground.

IA: Expect low to moderate to active fire behavior once fires become established. Should be well within the production rates and flame lengths constraints for dozers and engines.

AIR OPERATIONS:

No air visibilities restrictions after 0900. Little smoke to hamper flights, and be aware of afternoon storms.

SAFETY:

Monitor lines throughout the drying period of the day to avoid breaches in the lines from winds and directional changes.

Commercial traffic will increase in town today, so watch out for the other drivers!!! Don't park large vehicles in tight spaces when it is not necessary, leave safe distance to pull out when needed.

Dehydration in these temperatures is common, even if your work load has decreased – so drink plenty of water before, during and after shift.

More accidents and injuries occur during the mop up phase of the fire than any other, so look up, down and around to avoid hazards..

If it lives here, it Bites! Snakes, ticks, alligators, bears, sand gnats and other critters are on the move so watch where you walk and check yourself for ticks daily. Do Not play with the wildlife!
