WEATHER DISCUSSION: An upper level ridge will remain over the area into the weekend, leading to only isolated showers and thunderstorms, mainly along the seabreeze. Most areas should not experience rainfall.

The **main concerns are:**

1. Warm temperatures and heat indices approaching 100.
2. Afternoon Sea Breeze passage possible with gusty winds and isolated showers and thunderstorms

WEATHER FORECAST DAY SHIFT FRIDAY: (See table for specific incident forecasts)

WEATHER: Mostly sunny around noon, followed by a cumulus developing around 1100. Isolated showers and thunderstorms mainly after 1500. Chance of measurable rain 20%.

MAX TEMPERATURES: 92-95 (24 hour trend: unchanged)

MIN HUMIDITY: 37 to 42% (24 hour trend: unchanged)

WEATHER: An isolated shower or thunderstorm before 2200, otherwise mostly clear. Patchy fog and smoke after 0200. Chance of measurable rain 20 % early.

Partly cloudy. A 20 percent chance of afternoon showers and thunderstorms. Highs 94-97. NW winds 3 to 5 mph, then becoming SE 5-8 mph, with gusts to 15 mph as the sea-breeze passes. Min RH 35 to 40 %. Mixing height 6200 feet, dispersion index 25, transport winds west-northwest 4-7 mph.

Today's fire behavior is expected to moderate in the western divisions WI, WH, WG, & WW. These divisions are involved with the burnout in coordination with the Southern Area Red Team. The eastern and northern divisions should remain in the low to moderate range. Some interior pockets of fuel did not receive rain yesterday and are now burning with low intensities. Direct attack with dozers will be within capabilities and line production should be sufficient.

W – SW 3-5 mph in AM / becoming SE 4 – 8 with 15 mph gusts

Rates of Spread 28 ft/ min / Flame lengths 3'-5'

Probability of Ignition 60%

Everybody must be on the same page and ensure that any changes are communicated immediately. Remember, every change you make requires change in support, safety, and operations. Tailgate Briefings must be thorough and clear.

Watch out for potential thunder storms with lightning and winds shifts. Refer to the 30/30 Rule in IRPG noted below.

Obey the speed limit at all times. Be sure to check in and out with the ICP prior to travel and follow guidelines established in Interagency Incident Business Hand Book as related to safety. Wear your seatbelt and drive defensively.

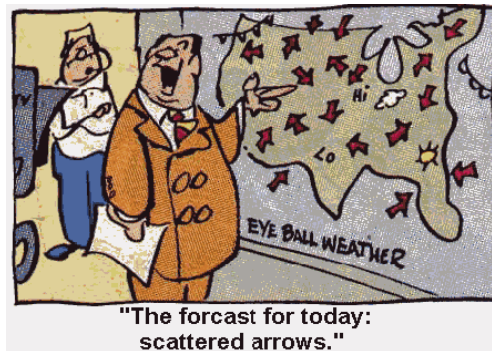
More water, more water, more water, Gatorade, more water... Drink more water now to prevent dehydration later. By the time you feel thirsty, your body has already started a dehydration process. Rotate arduous and heavy tasks when possible in hot dry weather.

Thunderstorm Safety

Approaching thunderstorms may be noted by a sudden reverse in wind direction, a noticeable rise in wind speed, and a sharp drop in temperature. Rain, hail, and lightning occur only in the mature stage of a thunderstorm.

Observe the 30/30 rule: a) If you see lightning and hear thunderclaps within 30 seconds take storm countermeasures identified below. b) Do not resume work in exposed areas until 30 minutes after storm activity has passed.

- Take shelter in a vehicle or building if possible.
- If outdoors, find a low spot away from tall trees, wire fences, utility lines and other elevated conductive objects. Make sure the place you pick is not subject to flooding.
- If in the woods, move to an area with shorter trees.
- If only isolated trees are nearby, keep your distance twice the tree height.
- If in open country, crouch low minimizing contact with the ground. You can use a pack to sit on, but never lay on the ground.
- If you feel your skin tingle or your hair stand on end, immediately crouch low to the ground. Make yourself the smallest possible target and minimize your contact with the ground.
- Don't group together.
- Don't stay on ridgetops, in wide open areas, near ledges or rock outcroppings.
- Don't operate land line telephones, machinery, or electric motors.
- Don't handle flammable materials in open containers or metal handtools.

Deviations from shortest practical driving route / nearest airport will only be allowed with written permission from the Home Unit and the IC

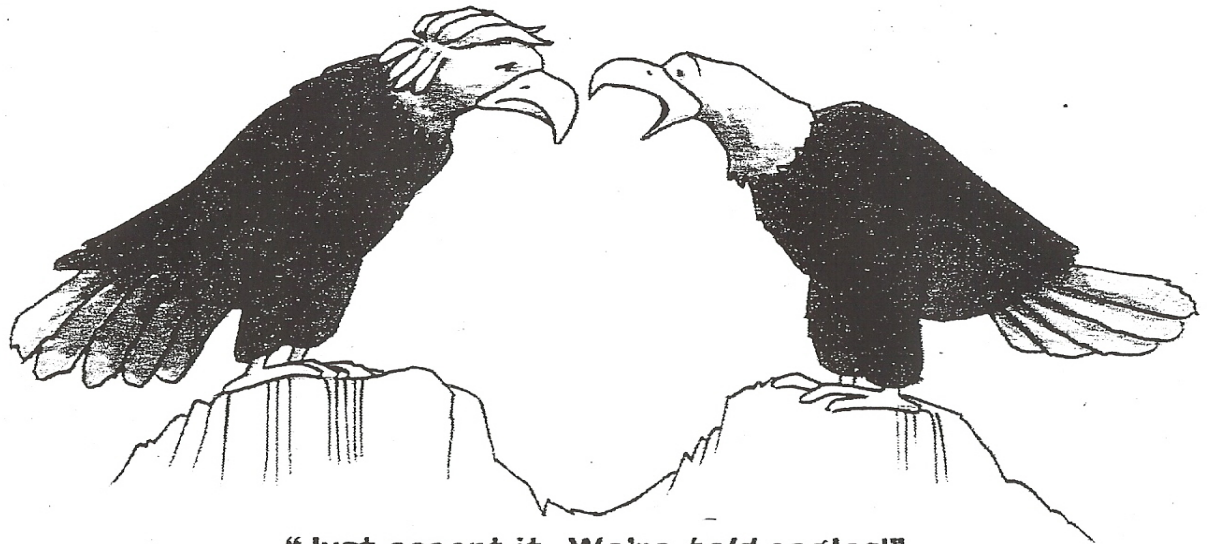
